Important - Please read these instructions fully before installing or operating

INSTALLATION WARNINGS

IMPORTANT: This product **MUST** be installed by a qualified electrician in accordance with local regulations.

IMPORTANT: Prior to Installation ensure that the local supply conditions (electricity voltage and frequency) are compatible with the requirements of your cooker hood.

IMPORTANT: Carefully unpack and examine the appliance for any damage. If you think there is a defect, do not use the appliance and contact Bush Product Support on 0345 257 7271. Packaging materials should be collected together and disposed of immediately as they may be harmful to children.

IMPORTANT: Ensure that the electric supply cable is not trapped or damaged during installation.

IMPORTANT: Protect your cooker hood against atmospheric effects. Do not expose your cooker hood to effects such as sun, rain, snow etc.

WARNING: The cooker hood must be mounted on the wall in accordance with the dimensions specified in the mounting diagrams.

DURING USAGE

IMPORTANT: Always replace the aluminium filter of the cooker hood with an original spare part otherwise the suction power may be reduced in addition to the reduction of service life.

WARNING: The LED lamps become hot during use, do not touch the surface.

WARNING: Disconnect the mains power before changing bulbs.

CAUTION: This cooker hood must be kept clean, oil or residue build up could be a fire hazard.

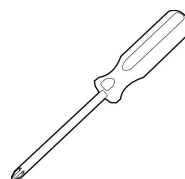
Unpacking

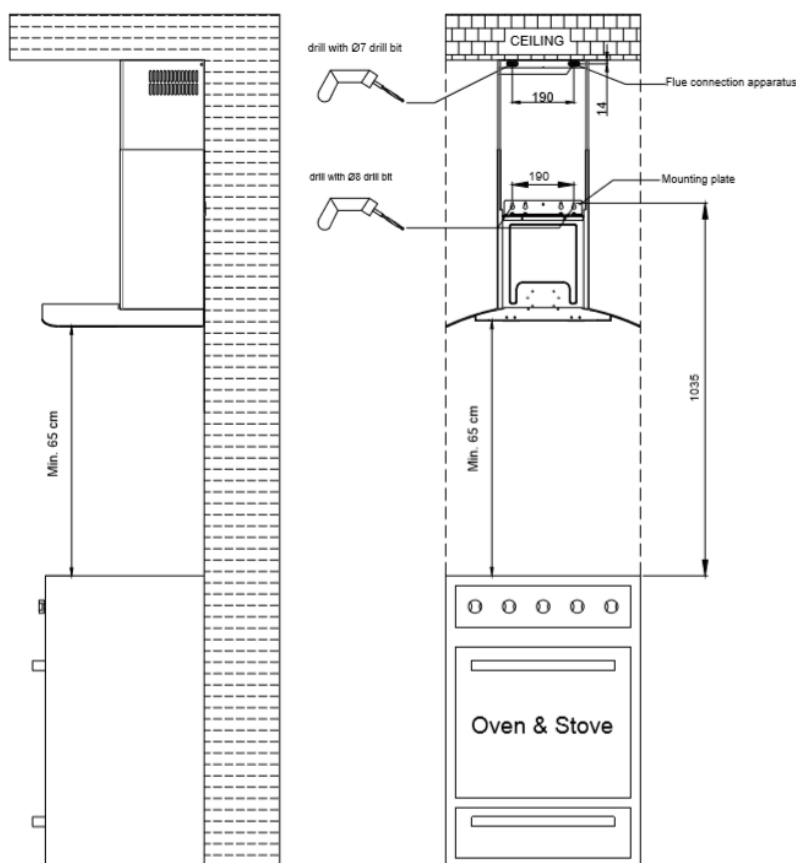

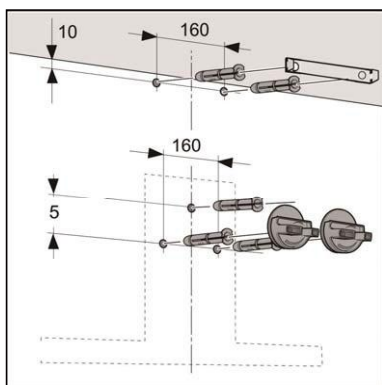

Mounting Instructions

Preparing the installation Caution!

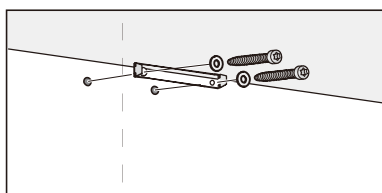
Ensure that there are no electric wires, gas or water pipes in the area where holes are to be made.

- Mark a vertical centre line on the wall from the ceiling to the lower edge of the extractor hood.
- Mark positions for the screws and the contour of the attachment
- Drill five 8 mm diameter holes to a depth of 50 mm for the attachments and press in the wall plugs flush with the wall.

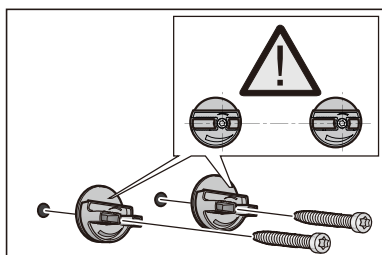


Installation

- Screw on the fixing bracket for the flue duct.



- Screw on brackets for the extractor hood hand-tight. Do not firmly tighten the screws.

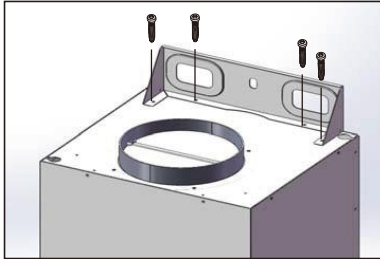

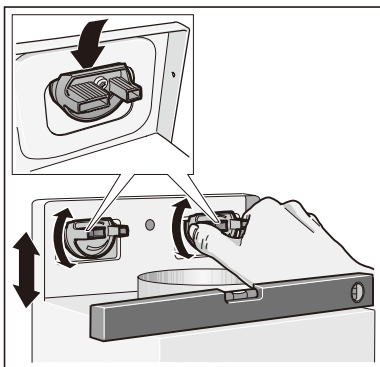

Attaching and aligning the appliance

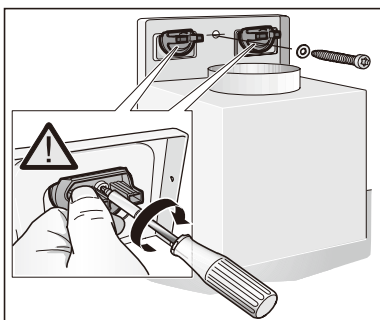
- First, fixing the mounting bracket, screw on the machine.



- When attaching the appliance, ensure that it engages firmly with the brackets.
- Align the appliance horizontally by turning the brackets. If required, the appliance can be moved to the right or left.



- Firmly tighten the screws for the brackets. When doing so, hold the brackets securely in place.
- Firmly tighten the screws.



Note: The wall fixings supplied may not be suitable for all wall types, and therefore it is the responsibility of the installer to ensure the wall fixings are appropriate for the surface that the Hood/Flue is being attached to

For the various installations use screws and screw anchors suited to the type of wall (e.g. reinforced concrete, plasterboard, etc.). If the screws and screw anchors are provided with the product, kindly check the screws are suitable for the type of wall in which the hood is to be fixed.

Fixing the Telescopic Flue

Arrange the electrical power supply within the dimensions of the decorative flue. If your appliance is to be installed in the ducting version or in the version with external motor, prepare the air exhaust opening. Adjust the width of the support bracket of the upper flue. Then fix it to the ceiling using the screws make sure that it is in line with your hood and respecting the distance from the ceiling. Connect the flange to the air exhaust hole using a connection pipe.

To transform the hood from a ducting version into a filtering version, ask the product service department for the charcoal filters and please follow the installation instructions.

This cooker hood can be used without access to outside filtration. A charcoal filter (not supplied) can be fitted to recirculate the extraction.

Electric Connection

The appliance has been manufactured as Class I, therefore earth cable is necessary

The connection to the mains is carried out as follows:

	IEC227
L=live	Brown
N=neutral	Blue
E=earth	Green/Yellow

If the plug is not provided, connect the electrical load as indicated on the description list. An omni polar switch with minimum aperture of 3mm between contacts; in line with the electrical load and local standards, must be placed between the appliance and the network in the case of direct connection to the electrical network.

The minimum distance between the support surfaces of the cooking pots on the hob top and the lowest part of the cooker hood must be at least 65cm. If a connection tube composed of two parts is used, the upper part must be placed outside the lower part.

Do not connect the cooker hood exhaust to the same conductor used to circulate hot air or for evacuating fumes from other appliances generated by other than an electrical source.

Before proceeding with the assembly operations, remove the anti-grease filter(s) so that the unit is easier to handle.

In the case of assembly the appliance, in the suction version prepare the hole for evacuation of the air.

Getting the most from your appliance

USE AND MAINTENANCE

It is recommended to operate the appliance prior to cooking.

It is recommended to leave the appliance in operation for 15 minutes after cooking is terminated in order to completely eliminate cooking vapors and odours.

The proper function of the cooker hood is conditioned by the regularity of the maintenance operations, in particular, the active charcoal filter.

The anti-grease filters capture the grease particles suspended in the air, and are therefore subject to clogging according to the frequency of the use of the appliance.

In order to prevent fire hazard, it is recommendable to clean the filter at a maximum of 2 months by carrying out the following instructions:

- Remove the filters from the cooker hood and wash them in a solution of water and neutral liquid detergent, leaving to soak.
- Rinse thoroughly with warm water and leave to dry.
- The filters may also be washed in the dishwasher.

Please take note that the aluminum panels may alter in color after several washes.

The active charcoal filters purify the air that is replaced in the environment. The filters are not washable or reusable and must be replaced at maximum every four months. The saturation of the active charcoal filter depends on the frequency of use of the appliance, also by the type of cooking and the regularity of cleaning on the anti-grease filters. To remove the charcoal filters place our hand on one filter at a time and turn it toward the front part. The charcoal filter can now be removed. Always ensure to replace both filters at the same time.

Clean the fan and other surfaces of the cooker hood regularly using a cloth moistened with denatured alcohol or non abrasive liquid detergent.

The illumination installation is designed for use during cooking and not for prolonged general illumination of the environment. Prolonged use of the illumination installation notably reduces the duration of the bulb.

Use a one-edged screwdriver or any other appropriate tool to lift and remove the overhead light fixture. Replace the damaged lamp. Use only LED lamps as the original specification, avoiding contact with hands. Return the light fixture to its position (snap fastening).

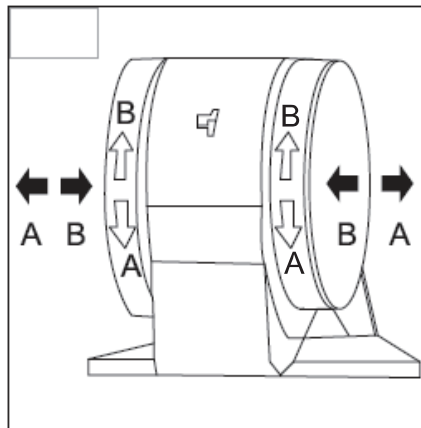

How to replace the charcoal filters:

The charcoal filters are supplied with appliance. These also can be sourced via the product support helpline.

As indicated in the diagram below, push charcoal filter as shown as arrow B and twist in a anti-clockwise motion to lock in. Twist in a clockwise motion as show as arrow A and pull outwards to remove filter.



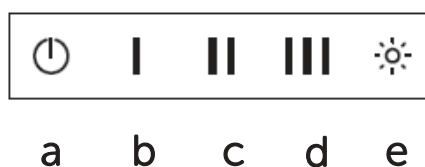
Warning

Use charcoal filters when your hood is in internal circulation. Exhaust pipe is unnecessary in this situation.

Cooker Hood Control Panel

The cooker hood has a 5 button control panel as shown in the image below.

- a. Reset button
- b. Low speed button
- c. Medium speed button
- d. High speed button
- e. Light button

Cleaning

WARNING! Isolate the power supply to the cooker hood before you start to clean appliance.

Do not clean using caustic creams, abrasive cleaning powders, thick wire wool or hard tools.

Clean the glass surfaces with special glass cleaning agents.

Never use flammable agents like acid, thinner or petrol when cleaning your cooker hood.

Do not clean your cooker hood with a steam cleaner.

Stainless Steel:

Stainless steel parts must be cleaned frequently with mildly warm soapy water and a soft sponge and then dried with a soft cloth. Do not use abrasive powders or abrasive cleaning materials. Do not leave anything spilled onto stainless steel parts for long periods of time.

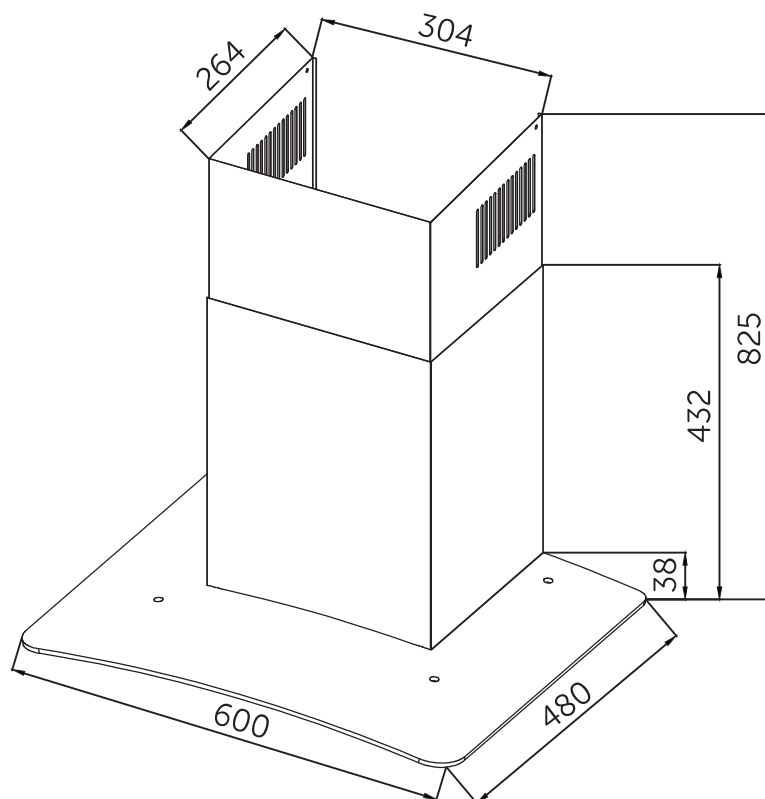

Problem	Possible reason	Solution
Hood doesn't work	No electric supply	Check whether the plug is connected
		Check whether the main switch is turned on
Poor airflow	Aluminum grease filters clogged	Clean the filters, assembly back when dry
	Charcoal filters clogged	Replace the charcoal filters
Motor running without air flow	Butterfly valve jammed	Contact technician
After running for a while, motor stop working	High temperature safety device activated	The kitchen is not sufficiently ventilated
	The hood is being installed too near to the cooking stove	The hood must be least 65cm of distance from the stove
Strong cooking smell	Charcoal filters not fitted	In re-circulating mode, charcoal filters must be installed
