Important - Please read these instructions fully before installing or operating

Power source

The TV should be operated only from a 220-240 V AC, 50 Hz outlet.

• Warning: Do not leave your TV in standby or operating mode when you leave your house.

Positioning the TV

For ventilation, please leave a clear space of at least 10cm all around the TV.(Fig 1)



Fig 1.

- Do not block the ventilation openings.
- **Do not** place the TV on sloping or unstable surfaces, the TV may tip over.
- To prevent damage to the TV, do not place any objects on top of the TV.
- Only use the TV in moderate climates.

Power cord and plug

- The power cord plug should be easily accessible. In case of storms and lightning, when going on holiday, or when the TV is not used for a long period of time disconnect the power cord from the mains power socket.
- Do not place the TV, furniture, etc. on the power cord or pinch the cord.

- Handle the power cord by the plug, do not unplug the TV by pulling the power cord.
- Never touch the power cord/plug with wet hands as this could cause a short circuit or electric shock.
- Never make a knot in the power cord or tie it with other cords.
- Power cords should be placed in such a way that they are not likely to be stepped on or driven over.
- A damaged power cord/plug can cause fi re or give you an electric shock. When damaged it must be replaced, this should only be done by qualifi ed personnel.

Moisture and water

- **Do not** use this TV in a humid or damp place (avoid bathrooms, the sink in the kitchen, and near the washing machine).
- Do not expose this TV to rain or water, as this may be dangerous.
- **Do not** place objects fi lled with liquids, such as fl ower vases, on top of the TV. Avoid from dripping or splashing.
- If any solid object or liquid falls into the cabinet, unplug the TV and have it checked by qualified personnel before operating it any further.

Ventilation

- The slots and openings on the TV set are intended for ventilation and to ensure reliable operation.
- To prevent overheating, these openings must not be blocked or covered in anyway.

Heat sources and flames

- Do not expose the TV to direct sunlight or other heat sources.
- The TV should not be placed near to open flames and sources of intense heat such as an electric heater.
- Ensure that no open fl ame sources, such as lighted candles, are placed on top of the TV.

Wall mounting (optional)

To prevent injury, this TV must be securely attached to the wall in accordance with the installation instructions (if the option is available).

LCD Screen

The LCD screen is a very high technology product with about a million thin film transistors, giving you fine picture details. Occasionally, a few non-active pixels may appear on the screen as a fixed blue, green or red point. Please note that this does not affect the performance of your product.
Take care not to scratch the screen with fingernails or other hard objects.

Cleaning

• Before cleaning, unplug the TV from the wall socket.

• **Do not** use liquid or aerosol cleaners. Only use a soft, dry cloth.

Batteries

Warning: Incorrect installation of batteries may cause battery leakage and corrosion, resulting in damage to the remote control.

Do not mix old and new batteries, or batteries of different types.

Do not dispose of batteries in a fire.



Do not dispose of batteries with normal household waste, take to a local recycling centre.

Replacement parts

When replacement parts are required, make sure that the service technician has used replacement parts,which are specified by the manufacture or have the same specifications as the original one. Unathorised substitutions may result in fire, electrical shock or other hazards.

Handling discs

• To keep the disc clean, only handle the disc by its edge. **Do not** touch the surface.



- Do not stick paper or tape on the disc.
- If the disc is contaminated with any substance like glue, remove before using it.
- Do not expose the disc to direct sunlight or heat sources such as hot air ducts, or leave it in a car parked in direct sunlight as the temperature can rise quickly and damage the disc.
- After playing, store the disc in its case.

Cleaning discs

• Before playing, clean the disc with a cleaning cloth. Wipe the disc from the centre out.

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Installing / Removing the Base Stand

Base Stand Assembly Instruction

 Place the TV with the display side down on a flat surface. Use a cloth to protect. Locate the bottom at the stand.
 Push the TV stand into the stand column until it snaps into place.



WALL MOUNTING INSTALLATION GUIDELINES

1. Place the LED LCD Television onto a solid surface. Please place some soft material over the front of the screen to protect it from any damage.

2. Remove the stand .

3. Remove the two screws that secure the stand column to the TV screen.

4. Remove the stand column.



INSTALLATION NOTES

This TV can be connected to an AC 100-240 Volts,50/60 Hz power supply. Never connect straight to a DC power supply.

Locate the TV in a room where light does not strike the screen directly. Total darkness or a reflection on the screen can cause eyestrain. Soft and indirect lighting is recommended for comfortable viewing.

Allow enough space between the TV and the wall to permit ventilation.

Avoid excessively warm locations to prevent possible damage to the cabinet or premature component failure.

5. Use the four screws provided to fix the TV onto a wall mounting bracket (not included) via the four VESA standard holes on the back of the television.

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Viewing control panel



- 1. Press to eject disc. (DVD mode)
- 2. Press to start playback or pause.(DVD mode)
- 3. VOL+ Increase the volume
- 4. VOL- Decrease the volume
- 5. CH+ Selects the next channel up

- 6. CH- Selects the next channel down
- 7. INPUT Accesses the Source menu
- 8. MENU Accesses the TV menus

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Aerial connection

Connect a coaxial cable (not provided) to the ANT/CABLE IN jack on the back of your TV and to the antenna or cable TV wall jack.



Connect the incoming cable from the cable wall jack to the cable-in jack on the cable or satellite box.Connect a coaxial cable (not provided) to the ANT/CABLE IN jack on the side of your TV and to the coaxial out jack. on the cable or satellite box.



Power connection

Connect the power cord plug to the mains power socket.

Please note: After unpacking, allow the TV to reach ambient room temperature before connecting the TV to the mains power socket.



Remote control - Inserting batteries

Remove the battery cover on the back of the remote control, gently push down and pull backwards at the same time as shown .

Insert two AAA/R3 or equivalent type batteries. Ensure the batteries are inserted the correct way and replace the battery cover.

Note: When the remote control is not going to be used for long periods of time, the batteries should be removed. Otherwise the remote control may be damaged, caused by battery leakage and corrosion.



Switching the TV On and Off

Switching the TV On

With power cord plug connected to the mains power socket and TV in **'Standby'** mode.

To switch the TV on from standby mode, either:

- a: The Remote control; Press the "U" button.
- b: The TV; Press the "U" button on the right of the TV.

Switching the TV Off

Either press the " \bigcirc " button on the remote control or press the " \bigcirc " button on the right of the TV, the TV will then switch to standby mode.

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Operation using TV control buttons

The **VOL+/VOL-** buttons will function as volume up/down as default. Even if you set other functions for these buttons, the **VOL+/VOL-** buttons will return to volume control after a short while.

Volume Setting

Press VOL+/VOL- buttons to increase or decrease volume. Programme Selection

Press CH+/CH- buttons to select the next or previous programme.

Operation using remote control

The remote control is designed to control all the functions of the model you selected.

Volume Setting

Press **VOL+** button to increase the volume. Press **VOL-** button to decrease the volume. A volume level scale (slider) will be displayed on the screen.

Programme Selection (Previous or Next Programme)

Press CH- button to select the previous programme. Press CH+ button to select the next programme. Programme Selection (Direct Access)

Press number buttons on the remote control to select programmes between 0 and 9. The TV will switch to the selected programme.







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How to watch a DVD

1.Press the "" button on the TV or remote control.

2.Switch to DVD source using the "**INPUT**" button on the remote control.

3.Insert a disc into the loader.

The no label side of the disc MUST be facing you when looking at the TV screen.



Label side

If play does not start automatically, press the " \triangleright II "button on the remote control, or the " \triangleright II " button at the right of the TV.

A menu may appear on the TV screen after a few moments or the film may start immediately after the Film/ TV Company introduction. This will depend on the disc content and may differ on each disc.

ps 4 and 5 are only available when a menu is orded on the disc.

4. Press the navigation buttons "▲▼◀▶" or the number buttons to select the required title.

5. Press the **OK** button. The selected item starts to play.

Notes on DVD playback

• No sound will be heard during Rapid advance or Rapid reverse.

- No sound will be heard during Slow motion play.
- Reverse Slow motion play is not available.
- In some cases, the subtitle language will not be changed immediately to the selected one.

• When the preferred language will not select, even after pressing the button several times, it means the language is not available on the disc.

• When the DVD player is restarted or the disc is changed, the subtitle selection is automatically changed back to the initial settings.

• If a language is selected that is not supported by the disc, the subtitle language will automatically be set to the disc's priority (default) language.

• Usually a 'circulation' will happen while switching to another language, this means you can cancel the subtitle by pressing the same button a number of times until "Subtitle Off" appears on the screen.

• When the power is turned on or the disc is removed, the language heard will be the one selected at the initial settings.

- Some DVDs may not contain root and/or title menus.
- Reverse stepping is not available.
- For reference: If you attempt to enter a number greater than the total time of the current title, the time search box disappears and "Input Invalid ⊘" message appears on top-left corner of screen.
- The slide show is disabled when the ZOOM mode is on.



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DVD Controls

You can operate DVD, movie CD, music or picture CD's content by using the correct buttons on your remote control. Below are main functions of commonly used remote control buttons.

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Initial setup

1. Connect one end of the RF coaxial cable to the aerial socket on the wall and the other end of the cable to the RF (75 Ω) socket at the bottom of your TV.

2. Connect the mains cable to the mains socket after you have completed all the connections.

3. With power cord plug connected to the mains power socket and TV in **'Standby'** mode.At this stage, the TV switches to standby mode. The red LED indicator will illuminate on the front panel of the TV.

4. In standby mode, press the " \bigcirc " button on the right of the TV or the " \bigcirc " button on the remote control to turn the TV on. The red LED indicator will turn blue.

5. The first time you turn the TV on, it will go straight into First Time Setup menu. Press the ▲▼◀ ▶ buttons to navigate the menu and change the settings.

OSD Language

Selects your desired language to be displayed on the menu. The default on-screen menu language is set as English.

Mode Setting

Selects your desired mode setting.

• Home Mode: Viewing at home.

• Store Mode: For store demo, the brightness is higher than home mode.

Country

Selects the country where you will operate the TV. The default country is set as UK.

Tuner Type

Select Tuner Type: Cable / Antenna.

Auto Scan

Selects the auto scan type: DTV+ATV / DTV /ATV.

LCN Select LCN Type On or Off.

Auto Channel Update

Select Auto Channel Update Type On or Off.

Start

Press the OK button to start auto tuning. Auto Scan will commence. The display will show the progress of the tuning and the number of channels found.

6. If you want to skip the DTV tuning, press the **TV.MENU** button to interrupt the tuning half way. You will then go straight to ATV tuning. You may repeat the above step if you also want to skip the ATV tuning.

General operation

Press the **INPUT** button on the remote control and select DTV to switch the TV to Digital Terrestrial Television Broadcasting.

Information Banner

Whenever you change channel using the **CH+/CH-** buttons or the number buttons, the TV displays the broadcast picture along with an information banner on the top left of the screen (available only in DTV/ATV mode).

The information banner can be displayed a any time while watching TV by pressing the **INFO** button on the remote control.

Connections Bringing it all together

Left side connections explained

1. HDMI Input

Connects a device that has an HDMI socket. The TV can display High Definition pictures from devices such as a High Definition Satellite Receiver or DVD Player. These devices must be connected via the HDMI sockets or Component Socket. No sound connection is needed for an HDMI to HDMI connection.

2. USB Input

To connect devices to the TV, providing fast data exchange. USB will have function in USB/DTV mode.

3.MINI YPbPr

YPbPr Input socket is just suitable for YPbPr Mini Cable. Connect to a DVD player, Digital Set-Top-Box, or other AV devices with component (YPbPr)video output sockets. Note: Pls. use "MINI AV/YPbPr-R/L" socket, when you want to connect to YPbPr audio.

4MINI AV/YPbPr-R/L

Connect to the composite VIDEO and AUDIO (R/L) output sockets on external video devices.

5. CI Slot

Used to insert a CI card. A CI card allows you to view all the channels that you subscribe to. For more information, see "Conditional Access" section.

Left bottom connections explained

6. Headphone jack

To connect an external headphone to the TV. Connect to the HEADPHONE jack to listen to the TV from headphones. **Note:** Headphone volume can be changed using "VOL+" or "VOL-" buttons.

7. PC Input (VGA) / PC AUDIO

Connects a personal computer to the TV. Connect the PC cable between the PC INPUT on the TV and the PC output on the PC.

Note: If you connect a device to the TV via the PC cable, you should also use an audio cable to connect your device to the PC AUDIO INPUT to enable audio.

8. SCART socket

Inputs or outputs for external devices. Connect the SCART cable between the SCART socket on the TV and the SCART socket on the external device (decoder, VCR or DVD player).

Note: If an external device is connected via the SCART socket, the TV will automatically switch to SCART mode.

9. COAXIAL

To connect to the audio socket on the digital/ standard 5.1 audio system.

10.RF Input (ANT.)

Connects to aerial (antenna) or cable TV. If you use a decoder or a media recorder, you should connect the aerial cable through the device to the TV with an appropriate aerial cable.





Connections Bringing it all together

HDMI Connections

HDMI lets you enjoy high definition digital images and high quality sound by connecting the TV to external devices such as DVD players, set top boxes or gaming equipment. Power off both the TV and the device before making any connections.

For more information, refer to your device's own instruction book.

When connecting, switch **"INPUT"** to **"HDMI"** .See, **"Input Selection"** section.

Note: HDMI cable is not supplied.



SCART Connections

Most devices support SCART connection. You can connect a DVD recorder, VCR or decoder to the TV using the SCART socket.

Power off both the TV and the device before making any connections.

For more information, refer to your device's own instruction book.

Note: The Scart cable is not supplied.



VGA Connections

You can connect a computer (PC) to the TV to display your computer's screen image on the TV.

Power off both computer and TV before making any connections.

Use a 15-pin D-sub display cable to connect a PC to the TV. Use an audio cable between PC AUDIO inputs on the left side of the TV and audio output on your PC to enable sound connection.

When the connection is made, switch "INPUT" to "PC". See "Input selection" section.

Set the resolution that suits your viewing requirements. Resolution information can be found in the "Appendix parts". Note: The VGA cable is not supplied.

How to navigate menus - Selecting source

1. Press the **INPUT** button on the top o f the TV or the INPUT button on the remote control to display the Input source list.

2. Press the ▲ ▼ buttons to select the input source that you want: DTV / ATV / AV / SCART / YPbPr / HDMI / PC / MEDIA / DVD.

3. Press OK button to confirm your selection.

Electronic programme guide (EPG) (DTV mode)

This system has an Electronic Programme Guide (EPG) to help you navigate through all the possible viewing options. The EPG supplies information such as programme listings, start and end times for all available services. In addition, detailed information about the programme is often available in the EPG (the availability and amount of programme information will vary, depending on the particular broadcaster).

This function can be used only when the EPG information is broadcast by broadcasting companies.

The EPG displays the programme details for the next 7 days. **1.** Press the **EPG** button to switch on **EPG**.



2. Press **EPG** button or **EXIT** button again to switch off EPG and return to normal TV viewing.

Info bar commands:

RED (Prev. Date)

Press the RED button to view the schedule of the previous day.

GREEN (Next Date)

Press the **GREEN** button to view the schedule of the next day.

YELLOW (Schedule)

Press the **YELLOW** button to view the preset reminders in the schedule list. Press the **YELLOW** button to return to the EPG.

BLUE (Reminder)

Press the **BLUE** button while on the selected programme, the Reminder setting menu will be displayed. Press the ▲ ▼ ◀ ▶ buttons to adjust the settings and then press the Save button to confirm the settings. After confirmation, the **EPG** Schedule List will then be displayed with your preset reminders shown. Press the **YELLOW** button to return to the EPG. The TV will automatically tune to the selected programme when it starts.

Press to display detailed information of the selected programme (if available).

Teletext (ATV mode)

Teletext is a free service broadcast by some TV stations which gives up-to-the-minute information on news, weather, television programmes, share prices and many other topics. Using the Teletext control buttons you can view pages of information that are listed in the teletext INDEX.

To Turn on Teletext Function



Make sure the TV channel you are watching transmits teletext. "No Teletext" sign will show on the screen if teletext is not available.

In ATV mode, press the **TEXT** button to enter Teletext mode. Press the **INDEX** button to display the **INDEX** page. Press the **TEXT** button once to exit and the TV will return to the channel you were watching.

To select a page of text

Find the number of the page in the **INDEX** and enter it using the **0-9** buttons. The number of the page will appear on the top left corner of the screen.

The page counter will search for your page. When it finds it, the page will be displayed. To move to the next page of text, press the▲ button.

To move to the previous page, press the \checkmark button. To return to the **INDEX** page, enter the **"100"** by using the 0-9 buttons or press the **INDEX** button.

Mix

To view a page of text while watching a TV programme, press the **TEXT** button twice.

The text will be superimposed over the TV programme. Double height text If you have difficulty reading the text on the TV you can double the height of the text.

Press the **SIZE** button. The top half of the page will be displayed in double height text.

Press the **SIZE** button again. The bottom half of the page will be displayed in double height text.

Press the **SIZE** button again to return to the full page.

Page HOLD

If the page of text you have selected contains subpages, these subpages will automatically be displayed in order with a delay to allow you to have enough time to read the page. To stop the movie to the next sub page, press the **HOLD** button.

To continue moving through the sub pages, press the **HOLD** button again.

Alternative: Press the SUBPAGE button, and then use the **0-9** buttons to enter a 4-digit page number.

To Reveal Information

Press the **REVEAL** button to reveal concealed information (quiz answers etc.).

Press the **REVEAL** button again to conceal the information again.

Fasttext

At the bottom of the teletext screen is a row of subject headings in red, green, yellow and blue.

The remote control has a row of colour buttons corresponding to the row of coloured subjects on the screen.

Pressing one of the colour buttons will take you directly to the page corresponding to the subject heading.



Digital Teletext (DTV mode)

Digital teletext can access special digital teletext services and specific services which broadcast digital teletext. You will need to turn off Subtitle Function before using teletext. **1.** In DTV mode, press the **TEXT** button to display the teletext page.



2. Press the 0-9 buttons to select a page number.

3. Follow the instructions on digital teletext and move onto the next step by pressing OK, ◄ ►, RED, GREEN, YELLOW, BLUE or 0-9 buttons etc.

4. To change digital teletext service, select a different service by pressing the **0-9** buttons or the \blacktriangle buttons. **Alternative:** You may press the **RED** button to the **TEXT** button to display the teletext information when you see a \bullet red logo displayed on the screen (e.g. BBC).

5. Press the TEXT button to exit

Recording DTV Programme onto a USB Storage Device

Use this function to record the DTV programme you are watching on the main screen and save it for future viewing. The recording from timer programme or direct recording may have a little bit of delay when it starts to record the broadcast programme.

Please make sure the USB device is inserted. If not, a warning message will pop up.

1. Press the • **REC** button to record the programme that you are currently watching.



To display the recording information, press the \bullet REC button.



2. Press the Stop button to stop recording.

- If a hard disk is used, make sure its mains adapter is connected to the mains supply.
 If a USB hub is used, make sure its mains
- adapter is connected to the mains supply as the total current consumption may exceed 500mA.
- The maximum supported storage space of the hard disk is 1 TB.
- The file system only supports FAT32 format.

Image persistence - ghosting

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Definition of terms

Angle

Recorded onto some DVD discs are scenes, which have been simultaneously shot from a number of different angles (the same scene is shot from the front, from the left side, from the right side, etc.). With such discs, the ANGLE button can be used to view the scene from different angles.

Chapter Number

These numbers are recorded on DVD discs. A title is subdivided into many sections, each of which are numberd, and specific parts of video persentations can be searched quickly using these numbers.

Chapter Number

This refers to a high-density optical disc on which highquality pictures and sound have been recordedm by means of digital signals. Incorporating a new video compression technology (MPEG II) and high-density recording technology. DVD discs enables aesthetically pleasing fullmotion video to be recorded over long period of time (for instance, a whole movie can be recorded).

DVD discs have a structure consisting of two 0.6mm thin discs, which are adhered to each other. Since the thinner the disc, the higher the density at which the information can be recorded, a DVD disc has a greater capacity than a single 1.2mm thick disc. Since the two thin discs are adhered to each other, there is the potential to achieve doule-sided play sometime in the future for even longer duration play.

Subtitles

These are lines of text appearing at the bottom of the screen, which translate or transcribe the dialogue. They are recorded on the DVD discs.

Time Number

This indicates the playtime, which has elapsed from the start of a disc or a titile. It can be used to find a specific feature to be used. Availability is determined by the disc's manufacturer.)

Title Number

These numbers are recorded on DVD discs. When a disc contains two or more movies, these movies are numbered as title 1, title 2, etc.

Track Number

These numbers are assigned to the tracks, which are recorded on Audio CDs. They enable specific tracks to be located quickly.

LPCM

LPCM stands for Pulse Code Modulation and is digital audio.

MPEG

Short for Moving Picture Experts Group. This is an international standard for compression of moving images. On some DVDs digital audio has been compressed and recorded in this format.
