For household and indoor use only.

This appliance must be used for its intended purpose only and operated as instructed in this user manual.

Use only the voltage specified on the rating plate of the heater.

WARNING: In order to avoid overheating do not cover the heater.

WARNING: To reduce the risk of fire, keep textiles, curtains, or other flammable materials at least 1 m away from the air outlet.

- Only use this heater on a horizontal and stable surface.
- Do not place the heater immediately below a socket outlet.
- Do not use this appliance with a programmer, timer, separate remote-control system, or any other device that switches the heater on automatically, since a fire risk exists if the heater is covered or positioned incorrectly.
- To avoid risk of overloading your plug socket, the use of an extension lead with this heater is not recommended.
- Important- this heater is intended for floor use only. Do not mount on ceilings or walls.
- Do not use this heater in the immediate surrounding of a bath, a shower or a swimming pool.
- Do not leave the appliance unattended.

WARNING: Do not use this heater in small rooms, when they are occupied by people unable to leave the room alone, unless constant supervision is provided.

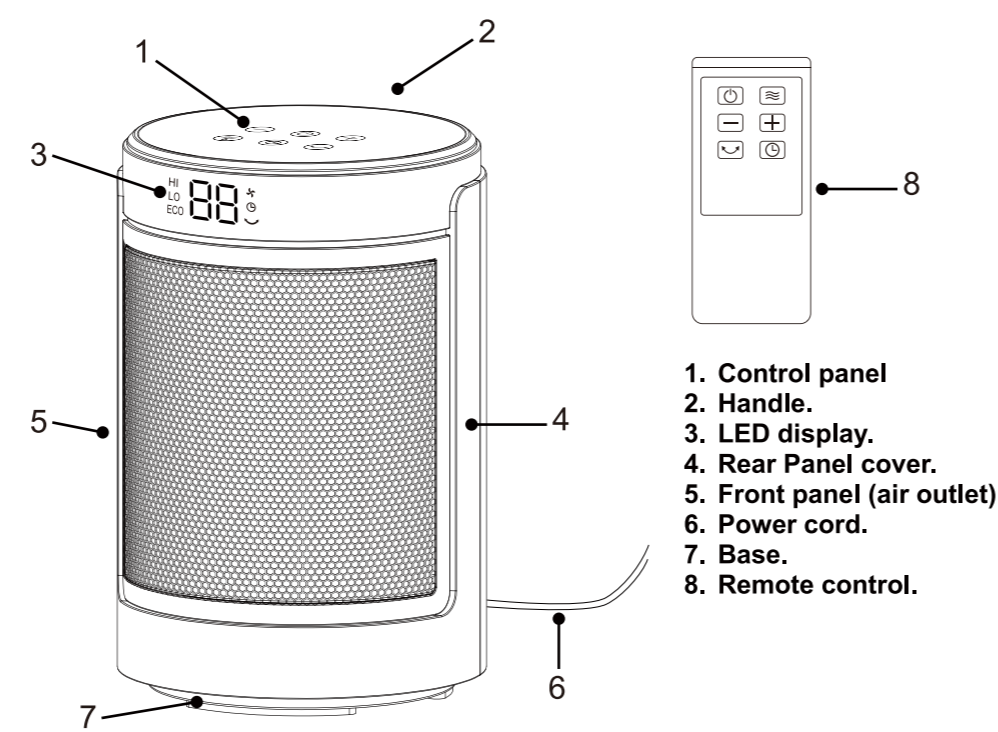
- This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children without supervision.
- Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- Children less than 3 years should be kept away unless continuously supervised.
- Children aged from 3 years and less than 8 years shall only switch

on/off the appliance provided that it has been placed or installed in its intended normal operating position and they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children aged from 3 years and less than 8 years shall not plug in, regulate and clean the appliance or perform user maintenance.

CAUTION- some parts of this product can become very hot and cause burns. Particular attention must be given where children and vulnerable people are present.

- Check the appliance before each use for signs of wear or damage. If damaged, discontinue from use immediately and do not use until the appliance has been inspected and approved for use by a qualified service person.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent, or a similarly qualified persons in order to avoid hazard.
- Always switch off the heater before removing the plug from the power socket.
- Do not remove the plug from the power socket by pulling on the cord, always grip the plug to remove.
- Always unplug the appliance when not in use, when moving the appliance or before cleaning.
- Do not immerse the appliance or its cord in water or any other liquids.
- Do not twist, kink, or wrap the cord around the appliance as this may cause the insulation to weaken and split.
- Do not run the power cord under carpets, rugs etc.
- Do not cover or restrict the airflow to the inlet or exhaust grilles, restricted airflow can cause the appliance to overheat and become a fire risk.
- Do not insert or allow any foreign objects to enter any ventilation or exhaust opening, as this may cause an electric shock, fire, or damage the appliance.
- Do not use this heater if it has been dropped.
- Do not use if there are visible signs of damage to the heater.
- Do not use the heater on deep pile carpets or long hair type rugs. Keep combustible materials such as drapes and other soft furnishings away from the heater.

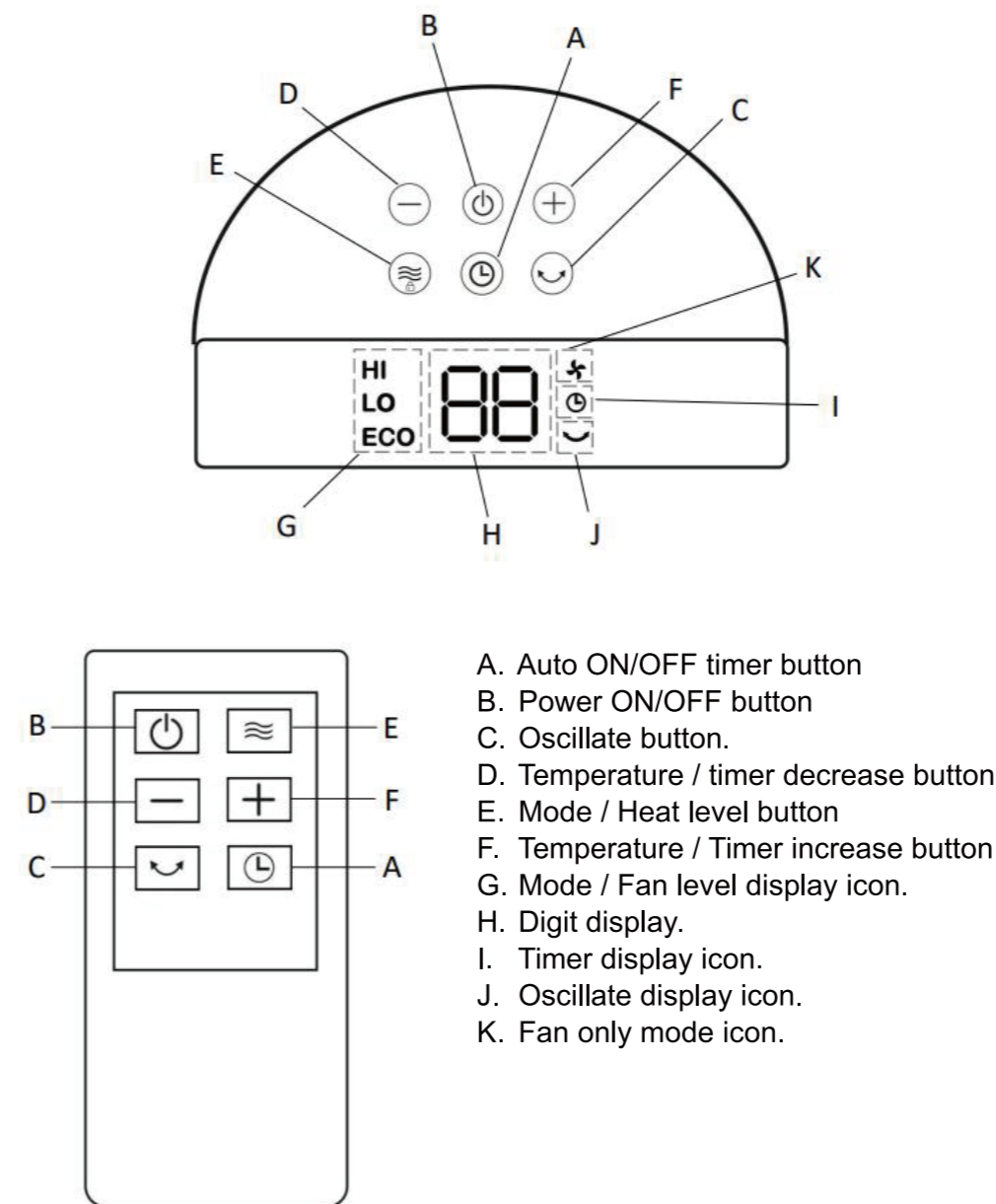
Remote control

- Follow the manufacturer's instructions when installing new batteries.
- Only use 'AAA' 1.5V batteries in this remote control.
- Be sure to insert correctly taking care to observe the correct polarity (+ and -).
- Do not mix old and new batteries.



WARNING: to avoid overheating do not cover the heater.

Control Panel.



Before using your heater.

Make sure you have read and understood the instructions fully.

- Check the appliance before each use for signs of wear or damage. If damaged, discontinue from use immediately and do not use until the appliance has been inspected and approved for use by a qualified service person.
- Position the Heater on a dry, level, sturdy surface, where it is unlikely to get knocked or tripped over and making sure the inlet and outlet grilles are free from obstruction.
- Connect the plug to the appropriate mains supply, making sure the plug is fully inserted.
- When you have finished using the heater. Make sure you switch off and unplug the power cord.

NOTE: care should be taken with the positioning of the appliance due to the mains cable creating a trip hazard.



Power On/Off Button. Press this button to switch the heater ON. The heater will start with the default settings; High fan mode and temperature setting of 35°C.

Press this button again to switch the heater OFF. NOTE: it takes 30 seconds for the heater to shut off, with a countdown time shown on the display.



Mode/ Heat + Child lock (5 second press)

When the heater is on, repeatedly press this button to cycle through the different modes: Hi (HI) → Low (LO) → ECO (ECO) → FAN only (FAN).

In ECO mode the heater will adjust between the High and Low modes automatically based on the ambient temperature.

The temperature can be set on High / Low and ECO mode but not fan only mode.

When the set temperature is reached, the display will flash and the heater will stop working. When the ambient temperature is lower than the set temperature, the heater will start working again.

Child Lock – hold the mode button down for 5 seconds to activate/ deactivate the child lock. The heater will beep twice to confirm the lock is enabled/ disabled. When the child lock function is on 'LC' will show on the screen.

Adjustment buttons – when the unit is on, press the + or – buttons to adjust the temperature from 5 to 36°C in 1°C increments. If you rapidly press these buttons or hold them down the temperature will change rapidly.

The adjustment buttons can also be used to adjust the Timer (see below).

Auto ON/OFF Timer button.

To set the timer to automatically turn the heater OFF. When the unit is powered on, press the Timer button and then use the controls + or – to adjust the hours on the timer. The timer will cycle through 00, 01, 02... up to 24hrs, once the time has been selected, it will confirm this automatically.

When the selected number of hours has been reached, the heater will stop running.

To set the Heater to automatically turn ON. Plug the heater in and while its in standby mode, follow the instruction above to set the timer. When the time is up, the heater will automatically turn on.

The cancel the timer setting, press the Auto ON/OFF Timer button on the heater and the timer indicator will flash. Then press the Auto ON/OFF Timer button again or press + or – to adjust the timer setting to 00 hours.

Oscillate Button – when the heater is switched on press the Oscillate button. The heater will start to move side to side to generate a wider spread of heat.

Remote Control Buttons.

The button on the remote control work the same as the ones on the heater, except for the child-lock function.



WARNING: to avoid overheating do not cover the heater.

Other Functions

Memory Function. If the heater is turned off then on again, the heater will resume operation in the mode it was in before it was turned off. If the heater is unplugged then plugged back in again, it will default to the original settings.

Tip over switch. When tipped over, the heater will automatically shut off. To restart the heater, turn it off at the plug and unplug the heater. Place the heater on a flat level and stable surface, then reconnect the plug to the mains power supply and switch the heater on again.

Overheat protection. When the inner temperature of the heater is abnormally high, such as when the heater is covered in operation, the heater will cut-out and stop heating in order to avoid risk of fire.

Care and Maintenance.

The heater requires regular cleaning to ensure trouble free operation:

- Always turn off and unplug the heater from the mains supply before cleaning.
- Make sure the appliance has cooled down completely before cleaning.
- Use a slightly damp cloth to wipe the exterior of the heater to remove dust and dirt. Never immerse the heater, cord or plug in any liquid.
- Use a vacuum cleaner or compressed air to remove dust and fluff from the inlet and outlet grilles.
- Ensure the heater is fully dry before plugging back into the mains supply.
- If the heater has collected dust or dirt inside the unit or around the element, have it unit cleaned by a qualified service agent. Do not operate the heater in this condition.

Storage.

- Do not store the heater whilst it is still hot.
- When the heater is not in use, it is recommended that the heater is re-packed in its original packaging and stored in a cool, dry place.

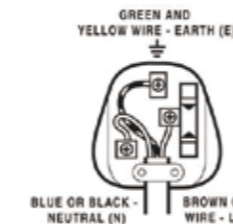
