Safety information

Important - Please read these instructions fully before installing or operating

INSTALLATION WARNINGS

IMPORTANT: This product **MUST** be installed by a qualified installer in accordance with local regulations.

IMPORTANT: Prior to Installation ensure that the local supply conditions (electricity voltage and frequency) are compatible with the requirements of your cooker hood.

IMPORTANT: Carefully unpack and examine the appliance for any damage. If you think there is a defect, do not use the appliance and contact Bush Product Support on 0345 257 7271. Packaging materials should be collected together and disposed of immediately as they may be harmful to children.

IMPORTANT: Ensure that the electric supply cable is not trapped or damaged during installation.

IMPORTANT: Protect your cooker hood against atmospheric effects. Do not expose your cooker hood to effects such as sun, rain, snow etc.

WARNING: The cooker hood must be mounted on the wall in accordance with the dimensions specified in the mounting diagrams.

WARNING: Install the cooker hood carefully, ensuring it does not come into contact with any metal parts of the building.

WARNING: Do not embed the cooker hood body into the wall, as this may result in electrical leakage.

IMPORTANT: Do not install the cooker hood in wet areas or damp rooms to avoid the risk of electric shock or damage.

IMPORTANT: Ensure the width of the gas hob is less than that of the cooker hood.

WARNING: The air must not be discharged into a flue that is used for exhausting fumes from appliances burning gas or other fuels.

IMPORTANT: When the range hood is located above a gas appliance, this distance shall be at least 65 cm.

WARNING: Failure to install the screws or fixing device in accordance with these instructions may result in electrical hazards.

IMPORTANT: This appliance is only intended to be installed over a hob with no more than four hob elements.

WARNING: If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.

DURING USAGE

IMPORTANT: This appliance is intended for domestic use only.

IMPORTANT: This appliance is not to be used by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction. Children being supervised not to play with the appliance.

IMPORTANT: Always switch on the cooker hood during cooking. Failure to do so may cause damage to the appliance or result in malfunction due to excessive heat.

IMPORTANT: Never operate a gas hob without cookware placed on it. Excessive heat may cause damage to the cooker hood body and lead to appliance failure.

IMPORTANT: There shall be adequate ventilation of the room when the cooker hood is used at the same time as appliances burning gas or other fuels.

WARNING: Do not flame under the cooker hood.

CAUTION: Accessible parts may become hot when used with cooking appliances.

IMPORTANT: Condensation may form on the surface of the cooker hood when used in low-temperature conditions. If this occurs, wipe the surface dry before operating the appliance.

IMPORTANT: Refer to this instruction manual for details on cleaning methods and frequency.

WARNING: There is a fire risk if cleaning is not carried out in accordance with the instructions.

IMPORTANT: Always replace the aluminium filter of the cooker hood with an original spare part otherwise the suction power may be reduced in addition to the reduction of service life.

WARNING: The LED lamps become hot during use, do not touch the surface.

IMPORTANT: The lamp is designed specifically for use in cooker hood. It is not suitable for household room illumination.

WARNING: Disconnect the mains power before changing bulbs. The light bulb(s) in this appliance is replaceable only by qualified engineers.

CAUTION: This cooker hood must be kept clean. Oil or residue build up could be a fire hazard.

SERVICE

IMPORTANT: Any electrical work required to do the servicing of the appliance should be carried out by qualified electrician or competent updated.

IMPORTANT: This product must be serviced by an authorized Service agent, and only genuine spare parts must be used. Installation by anyone other than an authorized agent may cause your warranty to be void.

WARNING: Failure to install the screws or fixing device in accordance with these instructions may result in electrical hazards.

Mounting Instructions

Preparing the installation

Caution! Ensure that there are no electric wires, gas or water pipes in the area where holes are to be made.

Fixing to the Wall

Ensure the fixings used for this hood are suitable. Check the area where the hood is to be fitted, to ensure that it is structurally sound and will support the weight of the appliance. Do not install direct onto plaster board using "Wall mates" or other similar anchors.

Cooker hood must be fixed into studs or noggins in the wall to ensure it is secure and minimize vibration in the wall.

Drill holes (A) according to the distances indicated (Fig.1)

Install 2 screws and hang the hood on the wall.

Once the hood is adjusted to the correct position, tighten the 2 screws and install other screws where necessary to ensure hood is properly secured against the wall.

For various installation types, use screws and screw anchors suited to the type of wall (e.g.reinforced concrete, plasterboard, etc.). If the screws and screw anchors are provided with the product, check that they are suitable for the type of wall on which the hood is to be fixed.

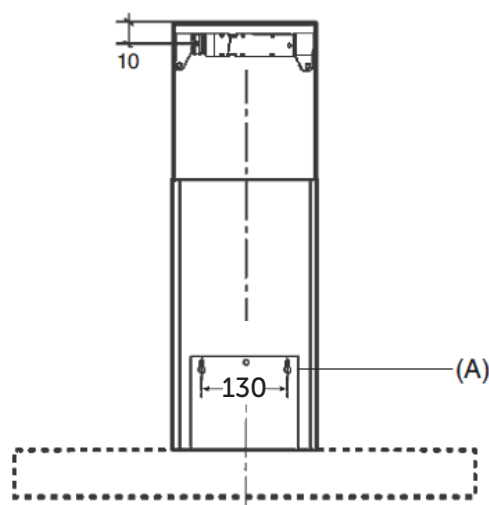

WARNING: Failure to install the screws or fixing device in accordance with these instructions may result in electrical hazards.

Fixing the Decorative Telescopic Flue

Arrange the electrical power supply within the dimensions of the decorative flue.

Prepare the hole in the ceiling or wall for the evacuation of the air.

Fix the upper flue cover to the support bracket with screws (B) (Fig.2)

Install butterfly flaps into the outlet on the top of the hood (C) (Fig.3).

Connect the ductwork to the outlet with a cable tie or suitable tape. Do not use screws.

Slide the lower flue cover down into the top of the hood.

Some models will require the lower flue cover to be fixed from underneath using the provided screws (Fig.3)

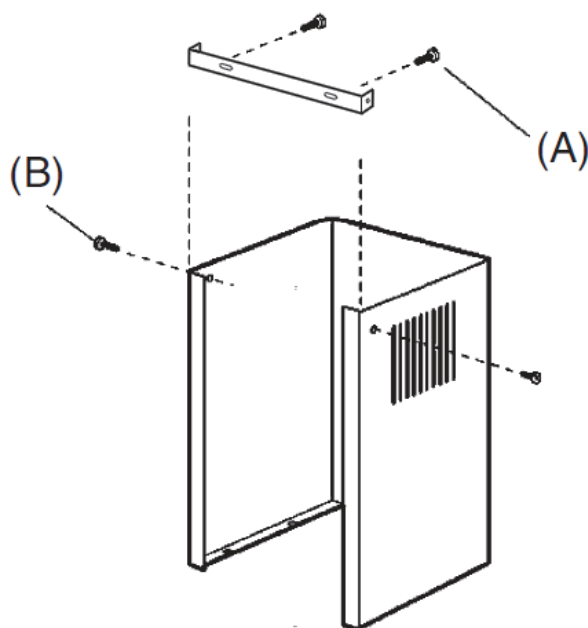

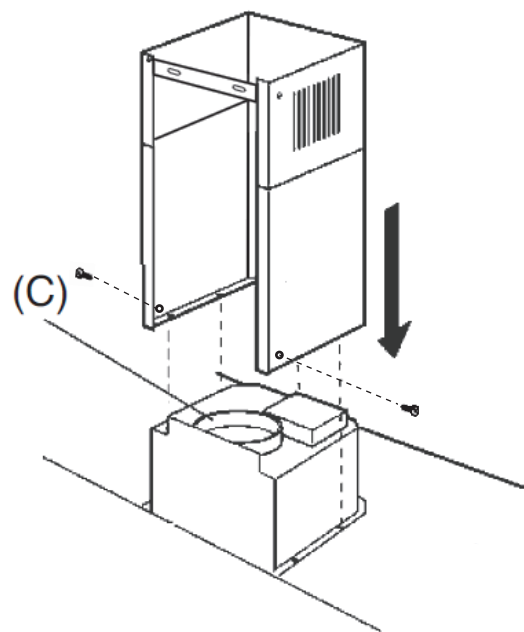

Getting the most from your appliance

USE AND MAINTENANCE

It is recommended to operate the appliance prior to cooking.

It is recommended to leave the appliance in operation for 15 minutes after cooking is terminated in order to completely eliminate cooking vapors and odours.

The proper function of the cooker hood is conditioned by the regularity of the maintenance operations, in particular, the charcoal filters (not included). The anti-grease filter captures the grease particles suspended in the air, and are therefore subject to build up of oil and grease depending on how frequently the appliance is used.

In order to prevent fire hazard, it is recommendable to clean the filter every 2 months by carrying out the following instructions:

- Remove the filter from the cooker hood and wash it in a solution of water and neutral liquid detergent, leaving to soak.
- Rinse thoroughly with warm water and leave to dry.
- The filter may also be washed in the dishwasher.

Please take note that the aluminum panels may alter in color after several washes.

If the cooker hood is operating in recirculation mode, (without ducting to the outside air) then charcoal filters must be purchased and regularly replaced. They are not washable or reusable and it is recommended that they are replaced every 4 months.

The saturation of the active charcoal filters depends on the frequency of use of the appliance, and also by the type of cooking and the regularity of cleaning of the anti-grease filters.

To remove the charcoal filters place your hand on one filter at a time and turn it clockwise. The charcoal filter can now be removed. Always ensure that both filters are changed at the same time. (see page 19 for further instructions).

Clean the fan and other surfaces of the cooker hood regularly using a cloth moistened with non abrasive liquid detergent. The cooker hood lighting is designed for use during cooking and not for prolonged general lighting of the kitchen. Prolonged use of the lighting notably reduces the lifetime of the bulb.

Use a flat head screwdriver to lift and remove the overhead light fixture. When replacing a damaged lamp, use only LED lamps, avoiding contact with hands. Return the light fixture to its position using snap fastening. (See page 20 for instructions).

Replacing the Charcoal Filters

Charcoal filters are supplied with the appliance and can also be obtained via the product support helpline.

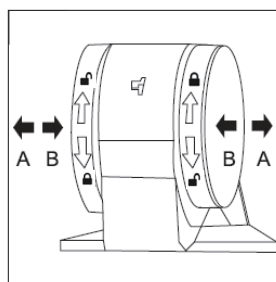
Refer to the diagram below:

To install:

Insert the charcoal filter in the direction of arrow B, then rotate the filter in the indicated direction to lock 🔒.

To remove:

Rotate the filter in the indicated direction to unlock 🔓, then pull outwards in the direction of arrow A.

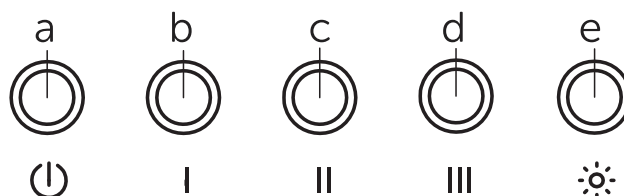


Warning

Use charcoal filters when your hood is in internal circulation. Exhaust pipe is unnecessary in this situation.

Cooker Hood Control Panel

The cooker hood has a 5 button control panel as shown in the image below.



- a. Fan stop button
- b. Low speed button
- c. Medium speed button
- d. High speed button
- e. Light button

Cleaning

WARNING! Isolate the power supply to the cooker hood before cleaning the appliance.

Do not clean using caustic creams, abrasive cleaning powders, thick wire wool or hard tools.

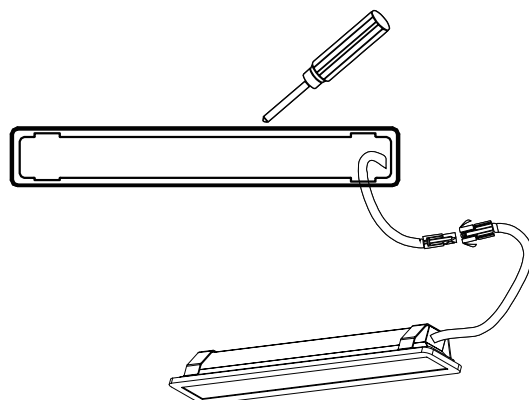
Clean the glass surfaces with special glass cleaning agents.

Never use flammable agents like acid, thinner or petrol when cleaning your cooker hood.

Do not clean your cooker hood with a steam cleaner.

Replacing Lamps

If your lamps require changing please contact a qualified Electrician.



Stainless Steel (If applicable):

Stainless steel parts must be cleaned frequently with mildly warm soapy water and a soft sponge and then dried with a soft cloth. Do not use abrasive powders or abrasive cleaning materials. Do not leave anything spilled onto stainless steel parts for long periods of time.

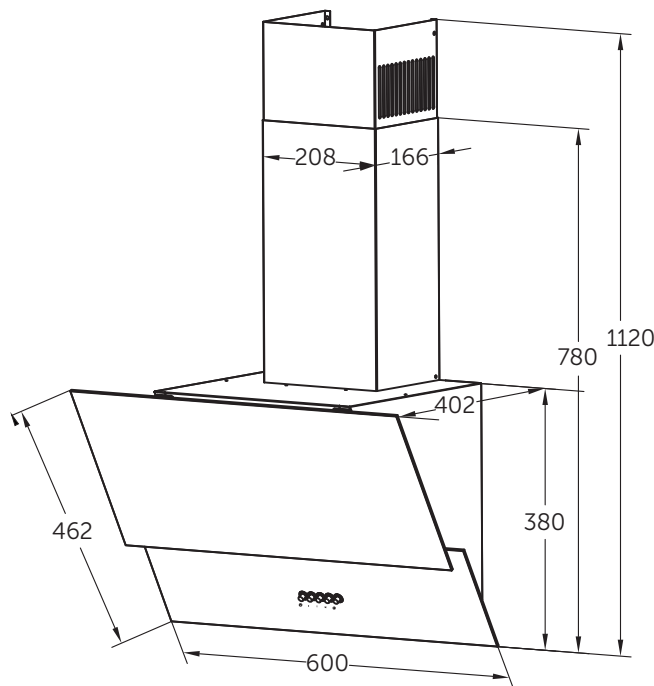

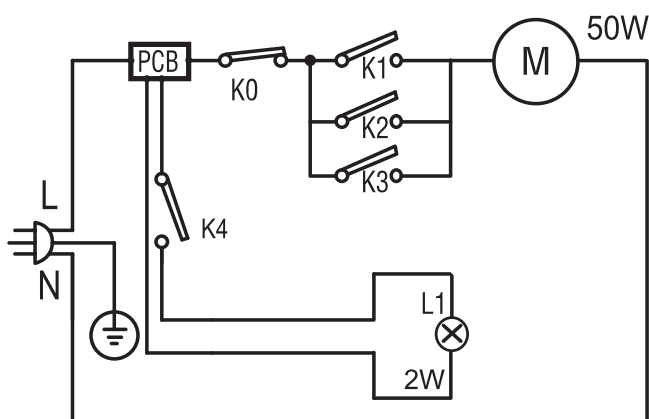

Motor running without air flow	Butterfly valve jammed	Contact technician
After running for a while, motor stop working	High temperature safety device activated	The kitchen is not sufficiently ventilated
	The hood is being installed too near to the cooking stove	The hood must be least 65cm of distance from the stove
