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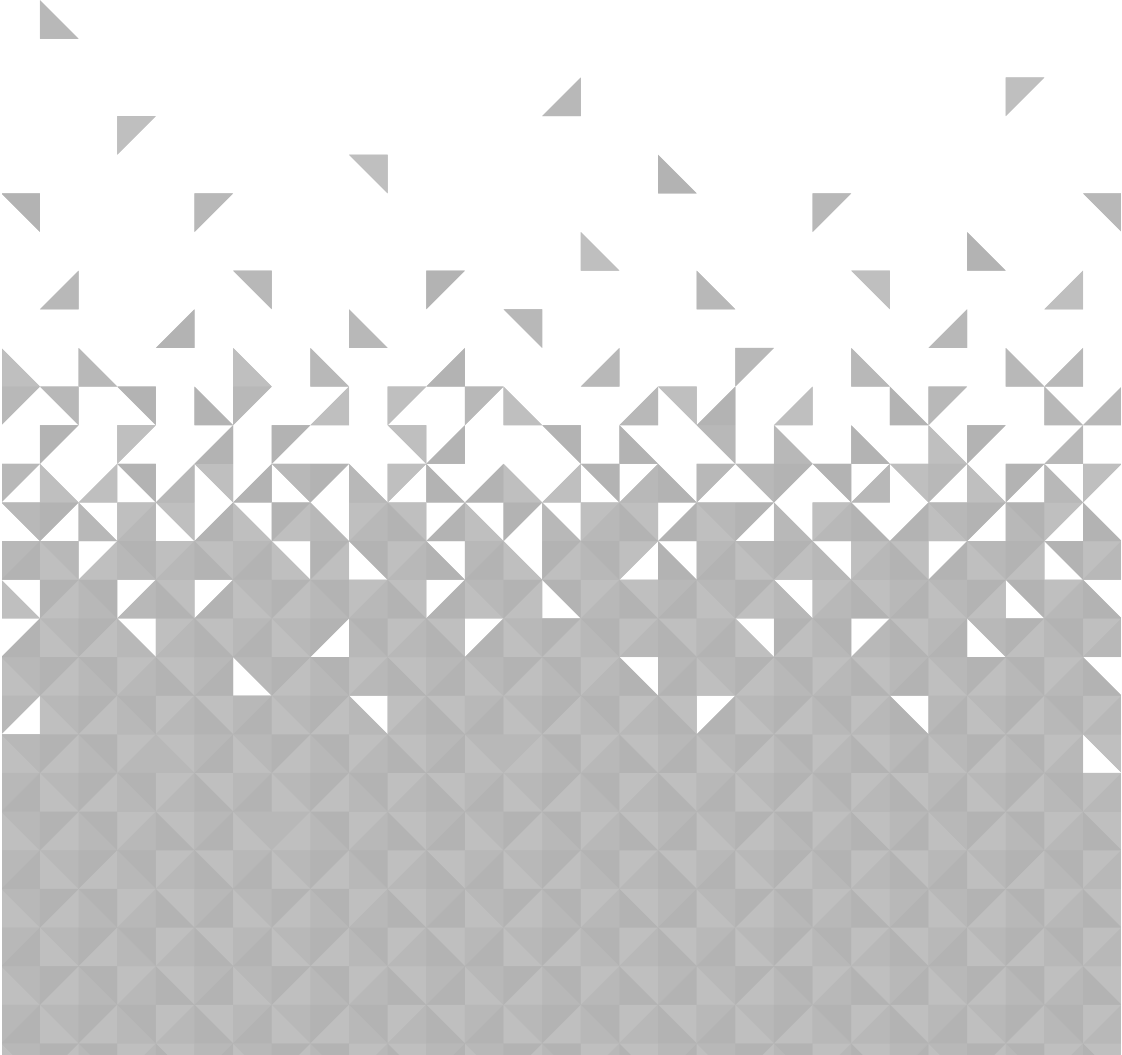

General safety information

- This product is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning the use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- Disconnect your DVD Player from the mains power supply during thunderstorms or electrical storms.
- Always check that you have completely switched off your DVD Player, before you change or disconnect the power supply.
- Do **NOT** attempt to open the product. This product does not contain any use
- Do **NOT** place foreign objects into the DVD compartment.
- This product is for Indoor use only.
- In order to avoid electric shock, do not bend, stretch, pinch or pull the power supply cable.
- Disconnect your DVD Player from the mains power supply during thunderstorms.
- Always check that you have completely switched off your DVD Player, before you change or disconnect the power supply.

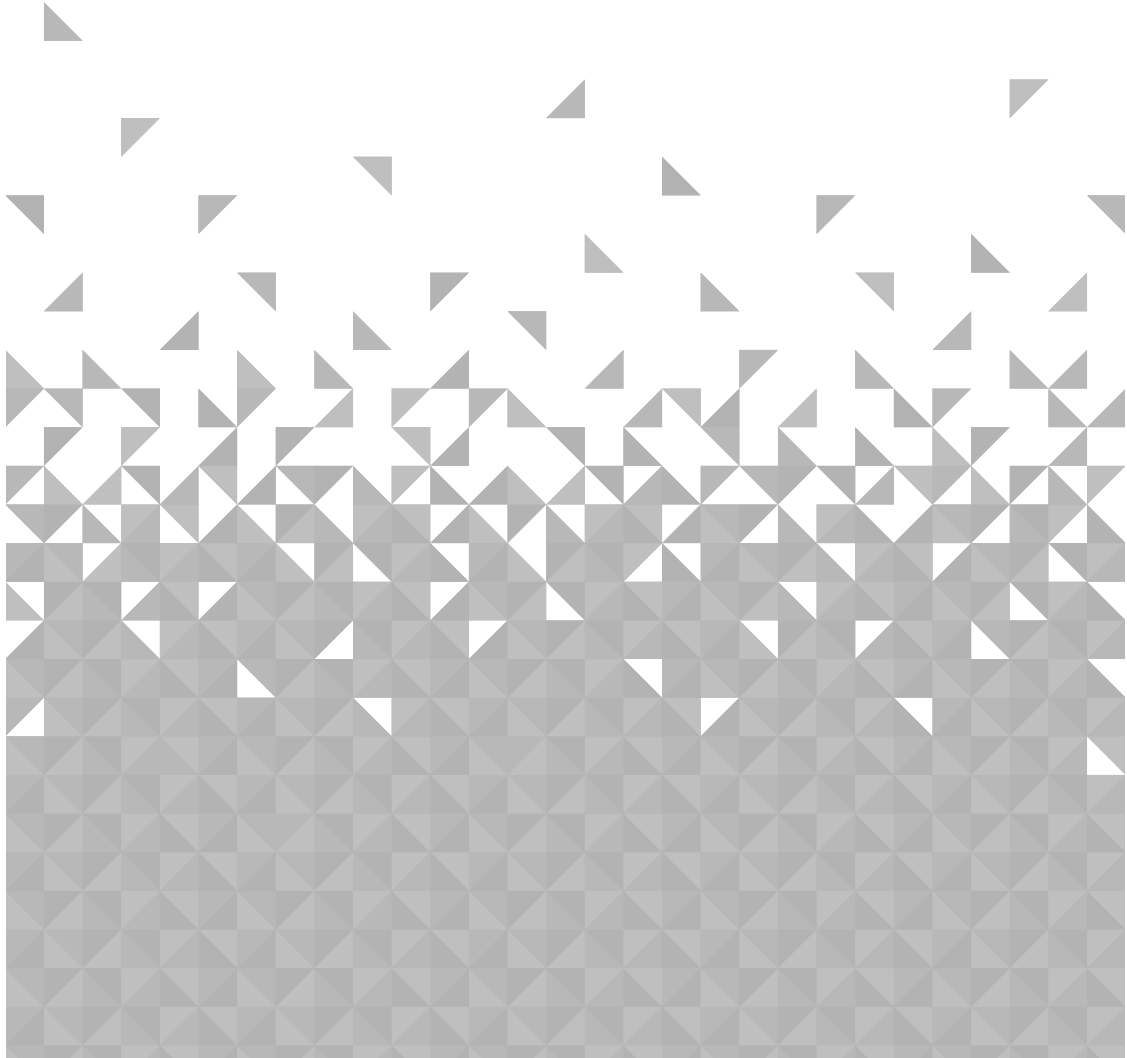

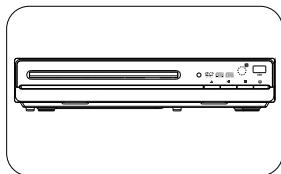

1 X DVD player

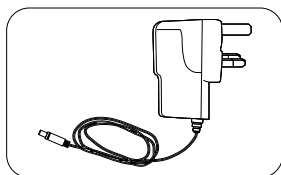

1 X Mains power adapter

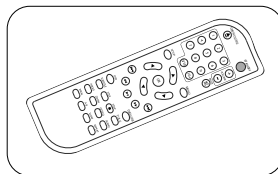

1 X Remote control

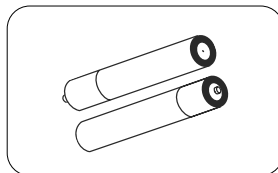

2 X AAA Remote control batteries

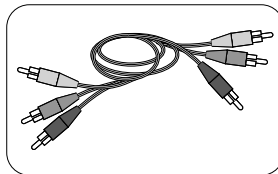

RCA cable

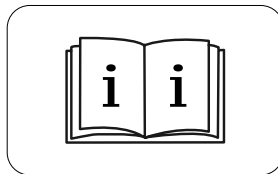

1.  DVD disc drawer Open/Close
2. Numeric 0-10 and 10+
3. Setup - Press to enter/exit the Setup menu
4. Navigation (Up/Down/Left/Right)
5.  Skip back
6.  Fast backward
7. On screen display (OSD) -During a movie, press to display on screen information (if available), or to turn this information off
8. Subtitle - During a movie, press to access the subtitle menu (if available)
9. Step - During a movie, press repeatedly to display frame by frame. Press  Play/Pause to resume normal playback.
10. Angle -During a movie with multi-angle options, press repeatedly to select your required viewing angle
11. Zoom -During a movie or image display, press repeatedly to zoom in or zoom out
12. Program - Press to enter/exit programming.
13. A-B - During a movie (if available), press to define the start point, press again to define the end point; the selected section will play repeatedly and continuously. Press again to cancel.
14. Power on/Standby
15. Volume up
16. Volume down
17. Mute - Press to turn the sound off/on
18. Menu - Press to display the DVD Menu screen (if available)
19. Enter/Select an option
20.  Skip forward
21.  Fast forward
22.  Play/Pause
23. DVD/USB- Press to access DVD or USB mode
24. DVD title menu (if available)
25.  Stop - During a movie, press once to stop, press again to stop completely

29. Slow - During a movie, press repeatedly to set a different playback speed. Press  Play/Pause to resume normal playback.

Making the connections

HDMI cable connection to the TV

HDMI cable (not supplied)

An HDMI cable connection carries uncompressed high speed video, audio and other digital information in 100% digital form. It enables transmission of crystal-clear digital video, multi-channel surround audio, and advanced control data through a single cable.

Connecting your DVD player to a TV with an HDMI cable:

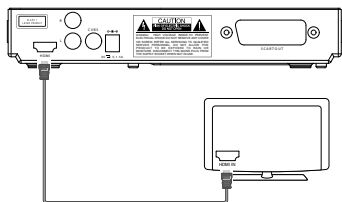

SCART cable connection to the TV

SCART cable (not supplied)

A scart cable connection will carry both video and audio and will provide you with good picture quality, widescreen switching and stereo audio.

Connecting your DVD player to a TV with a SCART cable:

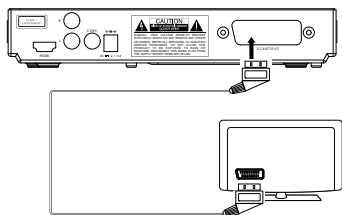

RCA cable connection to the TV

Using the RCA cable (supplied), the red and white plugs should be connected to the audio left and right channels. The yellow plug should only be connected to the video CVBS socket.

Note: When using this type of RCA plug and socket connection, they are always colour coded e.g. red plug to red socket etc.

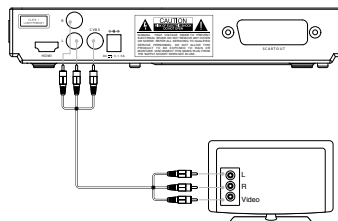

Installing the remote batteries

1. Press down the tab on the remote control battery door, in the direction of the arrow, to remove it.
2. Insert the 2 x AAA batteries supplied, taking care to the + and - markings and position the batteries the correct way around.
3. Replace the battery cover, making sure that it 'clicks' shut.

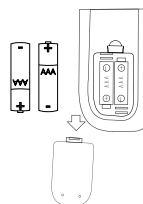

Remote control working range

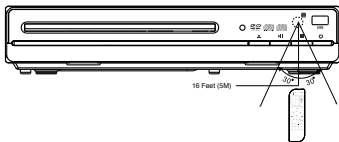

The remote signal may not be received if there is an obstacle between the remote control and the remote sensor on your DVD Player.

Note: Direct sunlight or other bright light sources shining on the remote sensor may affect the performance of the remote control.

2. Press the  Power button on the DVD Player or the **STANDBY** button on the remote control to go to Standby mode. The LED on the front right of your DVD Player will change to red.


Connecting the mains power


1. Connect the mains power lead into the socket on the back of the DVD Player (fig 7).
2. Plug the power adapter into the mains power wall socket and switch on.

Note: Do not connect the mains power until **ALL** other connections have been made.

3. The Red LED on the front right of your DVD Player will turn on and your DVD Player will now be in Standby mode.

Standby mode

Note: This DVD Player has been designed to go to Standby mode automatically after approximately 20 minutes of inactivity. Please press the  Power button on the product or the **STANDBY** button on the remote control, to turn the DVD Player back on again.

1. Press the  Power button on the DVD Player or the **STANDBY** button on the remote control to Power on the product. The LED on the front right of your DVD Player will change to green.

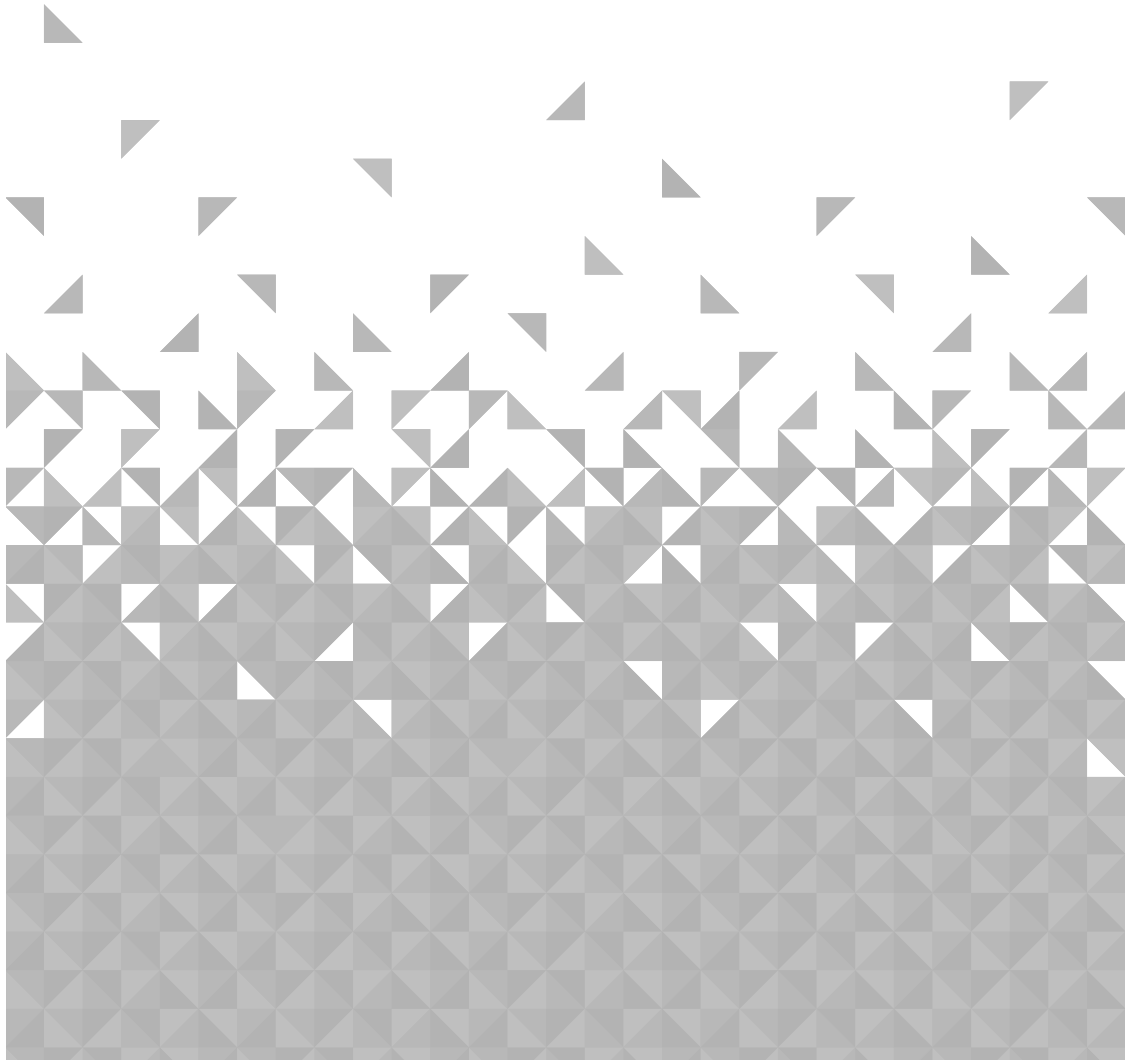

Getting started

1. Check that you have correctly connected all the cables and have installed the batteries in the remote control.
2. Switch on your TV/Monitor and check that it is set to the correct input, which for this DVD Player is HDMI, SCART or RCA phono/CVBS (composite video).
3. With the DVD Player in Standby mode, press the  Power button on the DVD Player or the **STANDBY** button on the DVD Remote control to turn the product on. The LED on the front right of the DVD Player will change to green.
4. Press the  Open/Close button on the DVD Player or on the remote control to open the DVD drawer.
5. Place the disc that you wish to play, label side up, on the DVD tray. Please ensure that the disc is laying flat within the recessed disc shaped area on the tray.
6. Press the  Open/Close button to close the drawer. The disc will start to play.

Adjust the volume

Volume +

Press and release to increase the volume in steps.

Press and hold to progressively increase the volume.

Volume -


Press and release to decrease the volume in steps.

Press and hold to progressively decrease the volume

Note: To gain optimal volume levels, adjust the volume on both the DVD Player and on the TV.


Mute


Press the  Mute button to turn off the sound.

Press the  Mute button again to turn the sound back on again.

Controls during playback

 Stop - Press once to pre-stop, Your DVD Player will remember the place where the disc was stopped. Press the  Play/Pause button to resume playback from this point. Press the  Stop button twice to stop play completely.

Repeat play (DVD/CD/JPG)

DVD

If available on your DVD disc, your DVD player has repeat options of CHAPTER, TITLE, REPEAT ALL and OFF.

1. Repeatedly press the **REPEAT** button to display and activate each available option.

CD

If available on your CD disc, your DVD player has repeat options of REPEAT 1 (single track) and REPEAT ALL (repeats all the tracks on the disc) and REPEAT OFF.

1. Repeatedly press the **REPEAT** button to display and activate each available option.

Note: Some discs may not allow repeat functions.

JPG images

Your DVD player has repeat options of

- REPEAT 1 (single image)
- REPEAT DIR (repeat all images in a folder)
- REPEAT ALL (to repeat all images on the disc)
- REPEAT OFF.

1. Repeatedly press the **REPEAT** button to display and activate each available option.

Using your DVD Player

Zoom (DVD, Images)

With your DVD Player you can zoom into an image or part of an image on the screen. Options of X2, X3, X4 and 1/2, 1/3 and 1/4 size are available.

1. Press the **ZOOM** button to activate the Zoom feature. Repeatedly press the **ZOOM** button to cycle through and display the available options.
2. When you are in Zoom mode, you can use the ▲ up, ▼ down, ◀ left and ▶ right buttons to scroll to the part of the picture that you wish to Zoom into.
3. To turn the Zoom feature off, repeatedly press the **ZOOM** button until ZOOM: OFF is displayed.

Note: Zooming into an image will degrade the quality as the pixels of the image are being enlarged.

Multi-angle (DVD)

Some DVDs contain scenes which have been shot simultaneously from a number of different angles. For these discs, the same scene can be viewed from each of these different angles by using the **ANGLE** button.

1. During playback, repeatedly press the **ANGLE** button to cycle through the available angles.

Note: If different angles are not available on your DVD 'Invalid key' will be displayed.

Subtitles (DVD)

1. Press the **Subtitle** button to turn the subtitles in a movie (if available), on or off.

Numeric keypad (DVD/CD)

You can use the numeric keys to go to a particular Chapter or Track when playing a DVD or CD disc.

1. Enter the chapter or track number using the numeric keypad.

2. For chapter or track number 10, press the **10+** followed by the **0** button. For chapters or tracks higher than 10, such as track 24, press the **10+** button twice and then the **4** button.

DVD/USB

You can switch between DVD and USB mode to view images or play music files from a USB stick.

1. Insert the USB stick into the USB socket on the front of your DVD Player.
2. Press the DVD/USB button and use the ▼ down button to highlight USB. Press the **OK** button.
3. Your DVD Player will now read the content on your USB stick. Please wait for a few moments.
4. When the content on your USB stick is displayed, you can use the ▲ up, ▼ down, ◀ left and ▶ right buttons to move to the image or music file that you want, then press the **OK** button.
5. To go back to DVD mode, press the DVD/USB button and use the ▲ up button to highlight DVD. Press the **OK** button.

Programming (DVD/CD)

During DVD or CD playback, you can program the order of the Chapter, Title, or Track that you watch.

1. Press the **PROG** button. The program setting menu will be displayed:

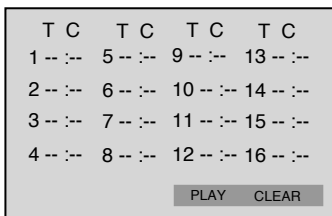

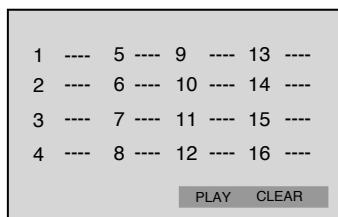

2. Use the direction and numeric buttons to enter and set the desired Title, Chapter or Tracks
3. After you have finished programming, use the direction buttons to highlight PLAY and then press the **OK** button.
4. To reset the programmed entries and start again. Use the direction buttons to highlight CLEAR and then press the **OK** button.

System setup

The SETUP menu enables you to set your preferences for the different options available on your DVD Player. You can use the **▲** Up, **▼** Down, **◀** Left and **▶** Right buttons to highlight each function or option and then press the **OK** button to confirm.

1. Press the **SETUP** button, to display the SETUP menu options.

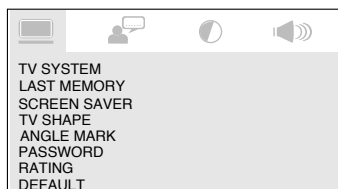

2. Use the **▶** Right and **◀** Left buttons to move across the 4 Setup menu option screens. A yellow bar will appear under the current menu option screen.

3. You can then use the **▲** Up, **▼** Down, **◀** Left and **▶** Right buttons to highlight each function or option and then press the **OK** button to confirm.

Setup - Last Memory

There are two options available, ON or OFF. If you set the Last Memory feature to ON and you play a disc that you have played before, the disc will start from the place it was last stopped.

Setup - TV Shape

The TV Shape option enables you to set the aspect ratio of the DVD Player to match to the connected TV. The following options are available:

- 4:3/PS (pan and scan)
- 4:3/LB (letter box)
- 16:9 (widescreen).

Setup - Angle Mark

There are two options available, ON or OFF. If you set the Angle Mark feature to ON and you play a disc that has multi angle viewing options, the Angle icon will appear in the display when this option is available

Setup - Password

You can set the viewing rating for your DVD Player and protect this with your own password:

Setting your own password:








1. Within the SETUP menu, scroll down and highlight PASSWORD and press the **OK** button. The 4 digit password and lock symbol will be highlighted **+**.
2. Enter the default password of 0000 and press the **OK** button. The lock symbol will change to be unlocked **+**.
3. Use the **▶** right arrow to highlight the 4 digit password and unlock symbol again. Enter your own 4 digit password and press the **OK** button. The lock symbol will be changed to be locked **+** again and your new 4 digit password has been saved.

To set the viewing rating:

1. Follow the steps above and ensure that the PASSWORD screen is displaying the unlock symbol . If the lock symbol is shown, enter the default password of 0000 or the new password you have set.
2. Scroll down and highlight RATING Use the  Right arrow to move to the Rating options, then use the  Up and  Down buttons to highlight your chosen rating. Press the  button to confirm.
3. Scroll up and highlight PASSWORD and then press . Enter the default password of 0000 or the new password you have set.
4. The lock symbol will change to be locked  and your viewing rating is now password protected.

Setup - Default

If you highlight this option and then move to RESTORE and then press the  button. The DVD Player will be reset to its factory default settings.

Setup - Video

If you are using the SCART or RCA cable (L, R and CVBS (Composite Video) connections), you will need to set the video output mode.

Select:

- RGB when connecting with a SCART cable
- CVBS when connecting using the RCA L, R and CVBS (composite video) cable.

Note: Do not connect multiple cables at the same time as this will cause picture quality loss.

Setup – HDMI Resolution

When using a HDMI cable to connect to a TV, you can select the resolution to match to the connected TV.

The following options are available:

- 480i/576i (standard progressive DVD resolution)
- 720P (1280x720 progressive HD resolution)
- 1080i (1920x1080 interlaced HD resolution)
- 1080P (1920x1080 progressive HD resolution)

Setup - Downmix

You can change the way that the audio is assigned to each speaker. There are two options available:

- LT/RT - the rear Left/Right channels on a Dolby 5.1 DVD disc will play on both the Left and Right speakers.
- STEREO - the rear left channel will play on the Left Speaker and the rear right channel will play on the Right speaker.

Note: The function depends on the Audio recording of each disc.

Setup – Dual Mono

You can change the assignment of audio channels to each speaker. The following options are available:

- STEREO: The left and right channels will be played respectively on the left and right speakers.
- MONO L: The left channel will be played on all speakers.
- MONO R: The right channel will be played on all speakers.
- MIX-MONO: Mixed right and left channels will be played on all speakers.

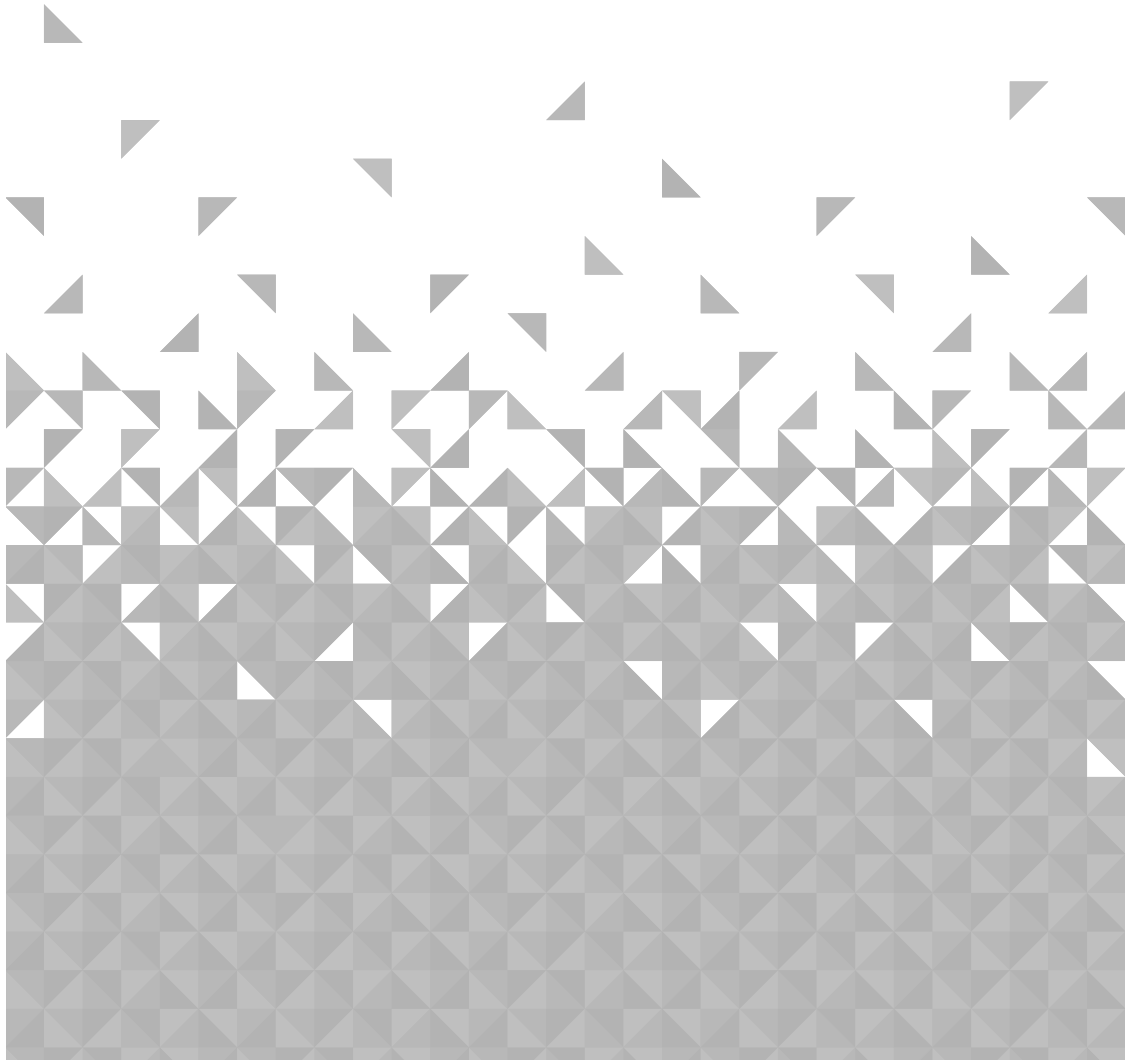

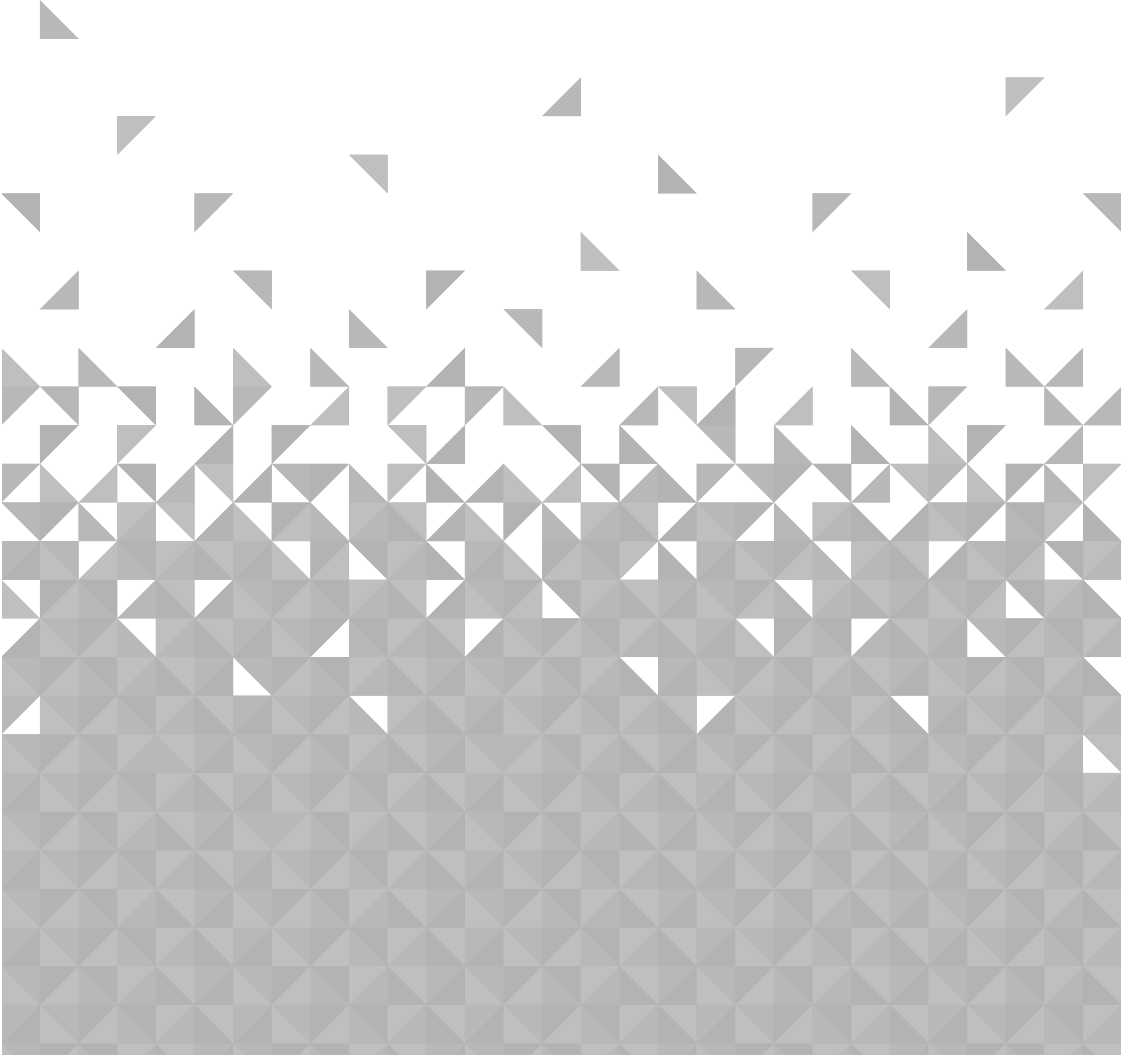

Troubleshooting

No power.

- Check the mains power plug connection at the wall socket and ensure that it is switched on.
- Check that the DVD player is not in Standby mode. The LED on the front of the DVD Player will be green when the product is powered on and red in Standby mode.

No picture and/or No sound

- Check the connections between the DVD player and the TV.
- Check that the DVD Player is not Muted. Increase the volume on the DVD Player and on the TV.

Unable to play

- There is no disc in the DVD/CD tray or it is upside down.
- The disc is not loaded properly. Press the ▲ Open Close button and check that the disc is correctly placed within the recessed area and that the picture side is facing up.
- It is the wrong type of disc or the disc is corrupted. This DVD Player is compatible with PAL Region 2 discs.
- The disc may be dirty. Clean the disc and try again

Some functions and features do not work

- Not all features and functions are available on all discs. Please try on a different disc.

The remote control is not working

- The batteries may be exhausted. Replace with new good quality batteries.
- The remote signal may not be received if there is an obstacle between the remote control and the remote sensor on your DVD Player.
