# Safety and Care Advice

### Important - Please read these instructions fully before starting assembly

• Check you have all the components and tools listed on pages 2 and 3.

• Remove all fittings from the plastic bags and separate them into their groups.

• Keep children and animals away from the work area, small parts could choke if swallowed.

• Make sure you have enough space to layout the parts before starting.

• Do not stand or put weight on the product, this could cause damage.

• Assemble the item as close to its final position (in the same room) as possible.

• Assemble on a soft level surface to avoid damaging the unit or your floor.

• Parts of the assembly will be easier with 2 people.



• We do not recommend the use of power drill/drivers *for inserting screws*,

as this could damage the unit. Only use hand screwdrivers.

• Dispose of all packaging carefully and responsibly.

#### Care and maintenance

• Only clean using a damp cloth and mild detergent, do no use bleach or abrasive cleaners.

- From time to time check that there are no loose screws on this unit.
- This product should not be discarded with household waste. Take to your local authority waste disposal centre.

# **Components - Fittings**

### Tools required

Eye protection (when using a hammer or glue)

Ruler/tape measure

### Step 1

### Attaching bottom panel

**a:** Use Screws **b** to fix Plastic Support **A** onto the Bottom Panel **4**.



**b:** Use Screws **B** to connect the Front Panel **5** onto the Bottom Panel **4**.



### Step 2

### Attaching side panel

**a:** Use Screws **b** to fix the Left Side Panel **2** onto the Bottom Panel **4** and the two Panels (Bottom and Middle) **3**.

*Note*: Use Allen Key **E** to fix Screws **D**.



**b:** Use Screws **()** to fix the Right Side Panel **1** onto Bottom Panel **4** and the two Panels (Bottom and Middle) **3**.

*Note*: Use Allen Key **E** to fix Screws **D**.



### Step 3

### Fixing back panel

Use Nails to fix the Back Panel 7 onto the unit.

*Note:* Use Nail Guide **C** to keep a constant distance from the edge.

Mark Back Panel 7 for position of fixed Horizontal. Do this left and right. Join marks with ruler to guide position for nails



### Step 4

### Fixing to wall

It is recommended that the bookcase is fixed to a wall.

See Wall Fixing Guidelines at the end of these Assembly Instructions

Use Screw **B** to fix the Wall Strap **G** onto the Top of the panel.



### Step 5

### Attaching Shelf Panel

Insert Shelf Supports **F** into the unit.

Insert the two stop elements **①** on the shelves as the drawing.

Ensure they are well fitted before inserting the Shelves.

*Note:* Set the shelf supports to the desired height.

Slide the Shelves 6 into the unit.



### Step 6

#### **Covering Sticker**

Use the Covering Sticker to cover the Screw Heads.

### Step 7

### Construct a corner configuration

Use Screws (B) to fix the Upper Corner Bracket (L) onto the front top edge of the panel.

Slot the front bottom edge of side panel into the Lawer Corner Bracket **(K**).

Make sure the Front panel 5 is positioned in the gap of Lawer Corner Bracket **(**).



# A Guide to - Wall Mounting & Fixings

### Important note:

If plastic wall plugs are supplied with your product:



- there are only suitable for use in masonry walls.

If you are in any doubt about the correct wall plugs for your wall, seek professional advice.

Failure of the product due to using incorrect fixings is the responsibility of the installer.

*Important:* When drilling into walls always check that there are no hidden wires or pipes etc.

Make sure that the screws and wall plugs being used are suitable for supporting your unit. Consult a qualified tradesperson if you are unsure.

### Hints:

- 1: General rule: Always use a larger screw and wall plug if you are not sure.
- **2:** Ensure you use the recommended drill bit to match the wall plug and hole size.
- **3:** Ensure you drill the hole horizontally, do not force the drill or enlarge the hole.
- **4:** Take extra care when drilling high walls, ceilings and ceramic tiles. Ensure wall plugs are inserted beyond the thickness of the ceramic tiles to avoid the tiles spltting or cracking.
- **5:** Ensure wall plugs are well fitted and are a tight fit in the drilled hole.

### Types of walls

You can use one of the following types of wall plug if your walls are made of brick, breeze block, concrete, stone or wood.

#### No.1 "General Purpose" wall plug



Generally aerated blocks should not be used to support heavy loads, use a specialist fitting in this case. For light loads, general purpose wall plugs can be used.

#### No.2 "Plasterboard" wall plug



For use when attaching light loads on to plasterboard partitions.



Care & Maintenance

#### No.3 "Cavity Fixing" wall plug



For use with plasterboard partitions or hollow wooden doors.

#### No.4 "Cavity Fixing-Heavy Duty" wall plug



For use when fitting or supporting heavy loads such as shelving, wall cabinets and coat racks.

**Safety:** Always check the fitting and location to ensure your safety in and around the home.

#### No.5 "Hammer Fixing" wall plug



For use with walls stuck with plasterboard. The hammer fixing allows it to be fixed to the wall rather than the plasterboard. Always check the fixing is secure to the retaining wall.

No.6 "Shield Anchor" wall plug Heavy loads



For use with heavier loads such as TV & HiFi speakers and satelite dishes etc.

**Fitting:** From time to time check the fitting to ensure the wall plugs or screws do not become loose.
