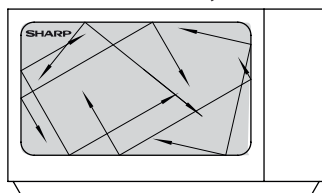


Microwaves are energy waves, similar to those used for TV and radio signals.

Electrical energy is converted into microwave energy, which is directed into the middle bottom of the cavity via a waveguide. Then the microwave stirrer distribute the microwave energy to every corner of the cavity evenly.

Microwaves cannot pass through metal, because of this the oven cavity is made of metal and there is a fine metal mesh on the door.

During cooking the microwaves bounce off the sides of the oven cavity at random.



Microwaves will pass through certain materials, such as glass and plastic, to heat the food. (See 'Suitable Ovenware' on page EN-11-12).

Water, sugar and fat in food absorb microwaves which cause them to vibrate. This creates heat by friction, in the same way your hands get warm when you rub them together.

The outer areas of the food are heated by the microwave energy, then the heat moves to the centre by conduction, as it does in conventional cooking. It is important to turn, rearrange or stir food to ensure even heating.

Once cooking is complete, the oven automatically stops producing microwaves.

Standing time is necessary after cooking, as it enables the heat to disperse equally throughout the food.

NOTE:

This model uses a glass flat tray instead of turntable. The glass flat tray is fixed by glue at the bottom of the cavity, it won't rotate like a turntable. Simply place your dish on top of the glass flat tray.

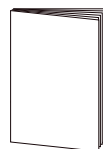

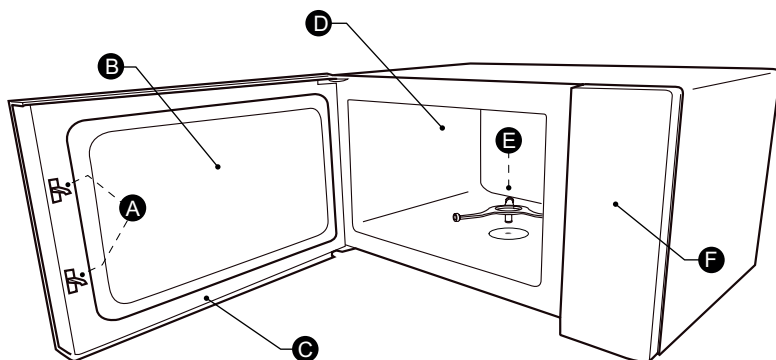

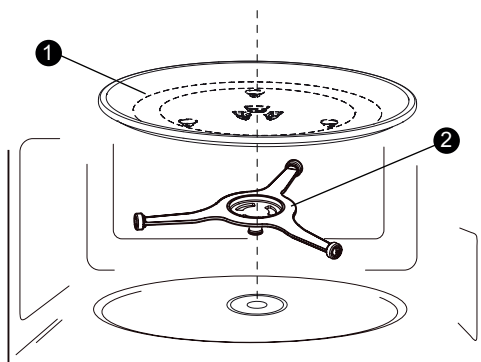

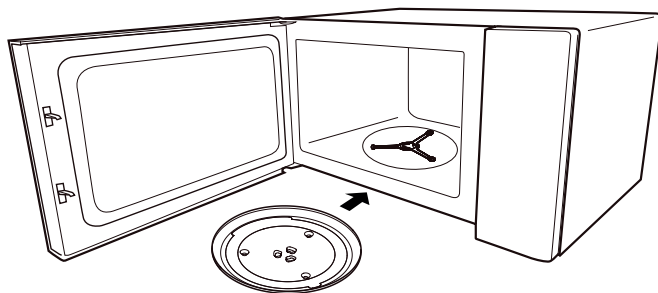
NAMES OF OVEN PARTS AND ACCESSORIES

Cleaning the cooking compartment and putting the turntable in place. For new installations, make sure all packaging and shipping tape has been removed. Before using the appliance to prepare food for the first time, you will need to put the turntable in place correctly. You must clean the cooking compartment and accessories.



1) Glass Tray

2) Turntable Ring Assembly



Notes:

1. Never use the appliance without the turntable. Make sure that it is properly engaged.
The turntable can turn clockwise or anti-clockwise.
2. Never place the glass tray upside down. The glass tray should never be restricted.
3. Both glass tray and turntable ring assembly must always be used during cooking.
4. All food and containers of food are always placed on the glass tray for cooking.
5. Never restrict the movement of the turntable.
6. If glass tray or turntable ring assembly cracks or breaks, contact your nearest authorized service center.

If you follow the instructions, your oven will provide you with many years of good service.

SAVE THESE INSTRUCTIONS CAREFULLY

PRECAUTIONS TO AVOID POSSIBLE EXPOSURE TO EXCESSIVE MICROWAVE ENERGY

- (a) Do not attempt to operate this oven with the door open since this can result in harmful exposure to microwave energy. It is important not to break or tamper with the safety interlocks.
- (b) Do not place any object between the oven front face and the door or allow soil or cleaner residue to accumulate on sealing surfaces.
- (c) **WARNING:** If the door or door seals are damaged, the oven must not be operated until it has been repaired by a competent person.

ADDENDUM

If the apparatus is not maintained in a good state of cleanliness, its surface could be degraded and affect the lifespan of the apparatus and lead to a dangerous situation.



IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

WARNING

To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, injury to persons or exposure to excessive microwave oven energy when using your appliance, follow basic precautions, including the following:

1. Read and follow the specific: "PRECAUTIONS TO AVOID POSSIBLE EXPOSURE TO EXCESSIVE MICROWAVE ENERGY".
2. This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children without supervision.
3. Keep the appliance and its cord out of reach of children less than 8 years.
4. If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.
5. **WARNING:** Ensure that the appliance is switched off before replacing the lamp to avoid the possibility of electric shock.
6. **WARNING:** It is hazardous for anyone other than a competent person to carry out any service or repair operation that involves the removal of a cover which gives protection against exposure to microwave energy.
7. **WARNING:** Liquids and other foods must not be heated in sealed containers since they are liable to explode.
8. When heating food in plastic or paper containers, keep an eye on the oven due to the possibility of ignition.
9. Only use utensils that are suitable for use in microwave ovens.



- 10.** If smoke is emitted, switch off or unplug the appliance and keep the door closed in order to stifle any flames.
- 11.** Microwave heating of beverages can result in delayed eruptive boiling, therefore care must be taken when handling the container.
- 12.** The contents of feeding bottles and baby food jars shall be stirred or shaken and the temperature checked before consumption, in order to avoid burns.
- 13.** Eggs in their shell and whole hard-boiled eggs should not be heated in microwave ovens since they may explode, even after microwave heating has ended.
- 14.** The oven should be cleaned regularly and any food deposits removed.
- 15.** Failure to maintain the oven in a clean condition could lead to deterioration of the surface that could adversely affect the life of the appliance and possibly result in a hazardous situation.
- 16.** The appliance must not be installed behind a decorative door in order to avoid overheating. (This is not applicable for appliances with decorative door.)
- 17.** Only use the temperature probe recommended for this oven. (for ovens provided with a facility to use a temperature-sensing probe.)
- 18.** The microwave oven shall not be placed in a cabinet unless it has been tested in a cabinet.
- 19.** The microwave oven must be operated with the decorative door open. (for ovens with a decorative door.)
- 20.** This appliance is intended to be used in household and similar applications such as:
 - staff kitchen areas in shops, offices and other working environments;
 - by clients in hotels, motels and other residential type environments;
 - farm houses;
 - bed and breakfast type environments.



IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

21. The microwave oven is intended for heating food and beverages. Drying of food or clothing and heating of warming pads, slippers, sponges, damp cloth and similar may lead to risk of injury, ignition or fire.
22. Metallic containers for food and beverages are not allowed during microwave cooking.
23. The appliance shall not be cleaned with a steam cleaner.
24. The appliance is intended to be used freestanding.
25. The rear surface of appliances shall be placed against a wall.
26. The appliances are not intended to be operated by means of an external timer or separate remote-control system.
27. The temperature of accessible surfaces may be high when the appliance is operating.
28. **WARNING:** When the appliance is operated in the combination mode, children should only use the oven under adult supervision due to the temperatures generated.

Electric Shock Hazard

Touching some of the internal components can cause serious personal injury or death. Do not disassemble this appliance.

WARNING

Electric Shock Hazard

Improper use of the grounding can result in electric shock. Do not plug into an outlet until appliance is properly installed and grounded.

This appliance must be grounded. In the event of an electrical short circuit, grounding reduces the risk of electric



shock by providing an escape wire for the electric current. This appliance is equipped with a cord having a grounding wire with a grounding plug. The plug must be plugged into an outlet that is properly installed and grounded.

Consult a qualified electrician or serviceman if the grounding instructions are not completely understood or if doubt exists as to whether the appliance is properly grounded.

If it is necessary to use an extension cord, use only a 3-wire extension cord.

1. A short power-supply cord is provided to reduce the risks resulting from becoming entangled in or tripping over a longer cord.
2. If a long cord set or extension cord is used:
 - 1) The marked electrical rating of the cord set or extension cord should be at least as great as the electrical rating of the appliance.
 - 2) The extension cord must be a grounding-type 3-wire cord.
 - 3) The long cord should be arranged so that it will not drape over the counter top or tabletop where it can be pulled on by children or tripped over unintentionally.

It is hazardous for anyone other than a competent person to carry out any service or repair operation that involves the removal of a cover which gives protection against exposure to microwave energy.

See the instructions on "Materials you can use in microwave oven or to be avoided in microwave oven." There may be certain non-metallic utensils that are not safe to use for microwaving. If in doubt, you can test the utensil in question following the procedure below.

Utensil Test:

1. Fill a microwave-safe container with 1 cup of cold water (250ml) along with the utensil in question.
2. Cook on maximum power for 1 minute.
3. Carefully feel the utensil. If the empty utensil is warm, do not use it for microwave cooking.
4. Do not exceed 1 minute cooking time.

Materials to be avoided in microwave oven

Utensils	Remarks
Aluminum tray	May cause arcing. Transfer food into microwave-safe dish.
Food carton with metal handle	May cause arcing. Transfer food into microwave-safe dish.
Metal or metal-trimmed utensils	Metal shields the food from microwave energy. Metal trim may cause arcing.
Metal twist ties	May cause arcing and could cause a fire in the oven.
Paper bags	May cause a fire in the oven.
Plastic foam	Plastic foam may melt or contaminate the liquid inside when exposed to high temperature.
Wood	Wood will dry out when used in the microwave oven and may split or crack.

Materials you can use in microwave oven

Utensils	Remarks
Browning dish	Follow manufacturer's instructions. The bottom of browning dish must be at least 3/16 inch (5mm) above the turntable. Incorrect usage may cause the turntable to break.
Dinnerware	Microwave-safe only. Follow manufacturer's instructions. Do not use cracked or chipped dishes.
Glass jars	Always remove lid. Use only to heat food until just warm. Most glass jars are not heat resistant and may break.

SUITABLE OVENWARE



Utensils	Remarks
Glassware	Heat-resistant oven glassware only. Make sure there is no metallic trim. Do not use cracked or chipped dishes.
Oven cooking bags	Follow manufacturer's instructions. Do not close with metal tie. Make slits to allow steam to escape.
Paper plates and cups	Use for short-term cooking/warming only. Do not leave oven unattended while cooking.
Paper towels	Use to cover food for reheating and absorbing fat. Use with supervision for a short-term cooking only.
Parchment paper	Use as a cover to prevent splattering or a wrap for steaming.
Plastic	Microwave-safe only. Follow the manufacturer's instructions. Should be labeled "Microwave Safe". Some plastic containers soften, as the food inside gets hot. "Boiling bags" and tightly closed plastic bags should be slit, pierced or vented as directed by package.
Plastic wrap	Microwave-safe only. Use to cover food during cooking to retain moisture. Do not allow plastic wrap to touch food.
Thermometers	Microwave-safe only (meat and candy thermometers).
Wax paper	Use as a cover to prevent splattering and retain moisture.

CARE AND CLEANING



Be sure to unplug the appliance from the power supply.

1. Clean the cavity of the oven after using with a slightly damp cloth.
2. Clean the accessories in the usual way in soapy water.
3. The door frame and seal and neighbouring parts must be cleaned carefully with a damp cloth when they are dirty.
4. Do not use harsh abrasive cleaners or sharp metal scrapers to clean the oven door glass since they can scratch the surface, which may result in shattering of the glass.
5. Cleaning Tip - For easier cleaning of the cavity walls that the food cooked can touch: Place half a lemon in a bowl, add 300ml (1/2 pint) water and heat on 100% microwave power for 10 minutes. Wipe the oven clean using a soft, dry cloth.

Additional information to the user manual concerning the operation safety

The microwave oven is intended for heating food and beverages. Drying of food or clothing and heating of warming pads, slippers, sponges, damp cloth and similar may lead to risk of injury, ignition or fire.

Do not use steam assisted cleaners to clean the appliance.



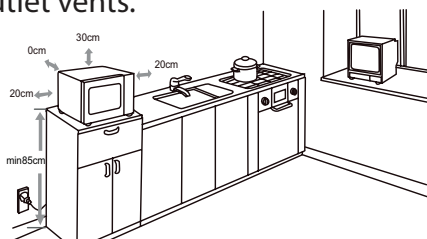
INSTALLATION

Countertop Installation

Remove all packing material and accessories. Examine the oven for any damage such as dents or broken door. Do not install if oven is damaged.

Installation requirements

1. Select a level surface that provide enough open space for the intake and/or outlet vents.

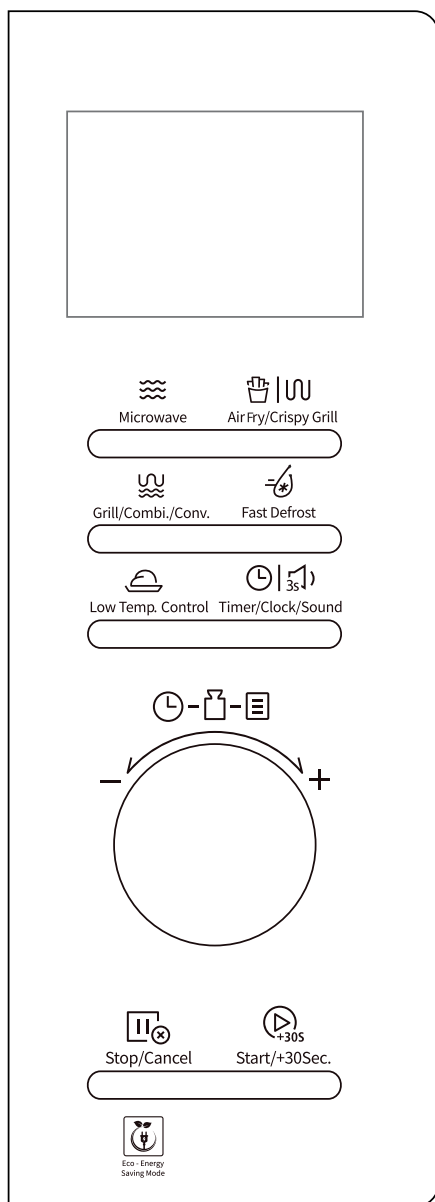


- (1) The minimum installation height is 85cm.
 - (2) The rear surface of appliance shall be placed against a wall. Leave a minimum clearance of 30cm above the oven, a minimum clearance of 20cm is required between the oven and any adjacent walls.
 - (3) Do not remove the legs from the bottom of the oven.
 - (4) Blocking the intake and/ or outlet openings can damage the oven.
 - (5) Place the oven as far away from radios and TV as possible. Operation of microwave oven may cause interference to your radio or TV reception.
2. Plug your oven into a standard household outlet. Be sure the voltage and the frequency is the same as the voltage and the frequency on the rating label.

WARNING: Do not install oven over a range cooktop or other heat-producing appliance. If installed near or over a heat source, the oven could be damaged and the warranty would be void.

OPERATION

1. Setting the Clock

After connecting the oven to the power, "0:00" shows on the display. The buzzer sounds.

- 1) Press " " twice, the screen will display " 00:00 ".
Timer/Clock/Sound
- 2) Turn the knob to set the hour figures.
- 3) Press " " to confirm.
Timer/Clock/Sound
- 4) Turn the knob to set the minute figures.
- 5) Press " " to confirm. The clock is set.
Timer/Clock/Sound

Notes:

- 1) The clock is a 24-hour display.
- 2) After the step 4, if " " is not pressed or if there is no operation within 5 minutes, the setting is invalid.
Timer/Clock/Sound

2. Setting the Kitchen Timer

- 1) Press " " once, the screen will display " 00:00 ".
Timer/Clock/Sound
- 2) Turn the knob to set the desired time. The maximum time value is " 95:00 ".
- 3) Press " " to confirm. The timer starts counting down.
Start/+30Sec.

3. Microwave Cooking

6 power levels are available.

- 1) Press " " once, the screen will display " P100 ".
Microwave
- 2) Turn the knob to set the power level. 6 power levels are available.
- 3) Press " " to confirm the power level.
Start/+30Sec.
- 4) Turn the knob to set the cooking time. The maximum time value is " 95:00 ".
- 5) Press " " to start cooking.
Start/+30Sec.

Note: If "P0" is selected, the default time is 5 minutes, and it cannot be changed.

4. Grill Cooking

- 1) Press " " once and then "G-1" will display.
Grill/Combi./Conv.
 - 2) Press " " to confirm.
Start/+30Sec.
 - 3) Turn the knob to set the cooking time. The maximum time value is "95:00".
 - 4) Press " " to start cooking.
Start/+30Sec.
- Note:** The buzzer will sound to remind you to turn the food over during grill cooking. If no operation, the oven will continue working.



5. Combination Cooking

- 1) Press "Grill/Combi./Conv." twice to enter the combination mode and then "C-1" will display.
- 2) Turn the knob to choose the combination mode, then the "C-1", "C-2", "C-3", "C-4" will display in order.
- 3) Press "Start/+30Sec." to confirm.
- 4) Turn the knob to set the cooking time. The maximum time value is "95:00".
- 5) Press "Start/+30Sec." to start cooking.

6. Speedy Cooking

- 1) In standby mode, press "Start/+30Sec." to cook food at 100% power level for 30 seconds. Each press on the same key can increase 30 seconds and the maximum time value is "95:00".
- 2) In standby mode, turn the knob left to set a cooking time at 100% power. Continue to turn the knob to adjust the cooking time. Then press "Start/+30Sec." to start cooking.

Note: In Microwave, Grill, Combination, Convection cooking state, each more press on "

"Start/+30Sec." can increase the cooking time by 30 seconds. (except the microwave cooking at P0)

7. Defrost by Weight

- 1) Press "Fast Defrost" once and then the screen will display "dEF1".
- 2) Turn the knob to set the weight of the food. The range of weight is 100 to 2000g.
- 3) Press "Start/+30Sec." to start defrosting.

Note: The buzzer will sound to remind you to turn the food over during defrosting. If no operation, the oven will continue working.

8. Defrost by Time

- 1) Press "Fast Defrost" twice and then the screen will display "dEF2".
- 2) Turn the knob to set the desired defrost time. The maximum time value is "95:00".



OPERATION

- 3) Press  "Start/+30Sec." to start defrosting.

Notes: 1) The buzzer will sound to remind you to turn the food over during defrosting. If no operation, the oven will continue working.

2) The defrost power is P30 and it cannot be changed.

9. Convection Cooking with Preheat Function



- 1) Press "Grill/Combi./Conv." three times and then "150°C" will display.
- 2) Turn the knob to set the temperature. 10 options are available, including 150, 160, 170, 180, 190, 200, 210, 220, 230, 240°C.



- 3) Press "Start/+30Sec." to confirm the temperature.



- 4) Press "Start/+30Sec." again to start preheating.
- 5) When preheating is completed, the oven will sound. Open the door and place food in the oven.
- 6) Close the oven door.
- 7) Turn the knob to set the cooking time. The maximum time value is "95:00".



- 8) Press "Start/+30Sec." to start cooking.

10. Convection Cooking without Preheat Function



- 1) Press "Grill/Combi./Conv." three times and then "150°C" will display.
- 2) Turn the knob to set the temperature. 10 options are available, including 150, 160, 170, 180, 190, 200, 210, 220, 230, 240°C.



- 3) Press "Start/+30Sec." to confirm the temperature.

- 4) Turn the knob to set the cooking time. The maximum time value is "95:00".



- 5) Press "Start/+30Sec." to start cooking.

11. Multi-Stage Cooking

Notes: 1) Two cooking stages can be set in multi-stage cooking.

2) If you set the defrost function, it will work automatically in the first stage.

3) The Kitchen Timer, Auto Menu, Preheat Function cannot be set as one of the multi-stage.

4) In the multi-stage cooking process (Except defrost by weight), each more press on



"Start/+30Sec." can increase the cooking time by 30 seconds.

Example: Defrost food for 5 minutes and then cook with 80% microwave power for 7 minutes.



- 1) Press "Fast Defrost" twice and then the screen will display "dEF2".



- 2) Turn the knob to set the desired defrost time to 5 minutes.
- 3) Press "Microwave" once and then "P100" will display.
- 4) Turn the knob to set the power level to P80.
- 5) Press "Start/+30Sec." to confirm.
- 6) Turn the knob to set the cooking time to 7 minutes.
- 7) Press "Start/+30Sec." to start cooking.

12. Air Fry

For air fry cooking you will need to select & confirm the type of food, please refer to the chart below.

- 1) Press "Air Fry/Crispy Grill" once and then "Ar01" will display.
- 2) Turn the knob to select the menu from Ar01 to Ar09.
- 3) Press "Start/+30Sec." to confirm.
- 4) Press "Start/+30Sec." again to start cooking.

Note: For the menus "Ar02-Ar09", the buzzer will sound to remind you to turn the food over during cooking. If no operation, the oven will continue working.

13. Crispy Grill Cooking

- 1) Press "Air Fry/Crispy Grill" twice and then "C1" will display.
- 2) Turn the knob to select the menu from C1 to C4.
- 3) Press "Start/+30Sec." to confirm the crispy grill menu.
- 4) Turn the knob to set the weight of the food.



OPERATION

- 5) Press "  " to start cooking.

Note: For the menu " C1 ", when the cooking time remains 5 minutes , the buzzer will sound to remind you to place cheese on the surface of the food.

14. Deodoriser Function

- 1) Press "  " once the screen will display " P100 ".
 (2) Turn the knob to set the power level until " P0 " will display.

- (3) Press "  " to start working.

Note: In the deodoriser working process, the default time is 5 minutes, and it can not be changed.

15. Low Temp Control

- 1) Press "  " once and then " L1 " will display.
 (2) Turn the knob to select the menu from L1 to L5.

- (3) Press "  " to confirm.
 (4) Turn the knob to set the temperature.
